

Test Format	How to Prepare
 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Students who are attending school in-person will test in-person. Students who are attending school virtually from home will test virtually from home.</li> <li>Despite the classroom format, all students will be taking their assessments digitally on their laptop.</li> <li>Every test has 90 minutes of active testing time and is divided into a multiple choice (MC) and free response (FR) section.</li> <li>Students will take the multiple choice exams in Aware. Students will take the free response exams in Aware (English and Social Studies) or OneNote (Math and Science).</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Study! Rewrite class notes, make flashcards, rework previous problems, make concept maps.</li> <li>Get your required supplies: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Laptop</li> <li>Loose scratch paper (not in a notebook)</li> <li>Pencil or Pen</li> <li>TI-Nspire or Basic Calculator (math and science)</li> <li>Headphones</li> </ul> </li> <li>If virtual, prepare to have a quiet testing location.</li> <li>Get a good night's sleep and eat a good breakfast.</li> </ul>

<p>Common Assessments count for 10% of a student's semester average!</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>We expect all testers to test with integrity and honesty.</li> <li>Students should not use any unallowable materials (notes, websites), should not share answers, and should not get help from any other person.</li> <li>Should a student be caught operating with academic dishonesty in any way, the student will receive a 50 for their Common Assessment grade and will face additional consequences as determined by the Dean of Students.</li> </ul>
Proctors and Test Locations	Cameras On Policy (Virtual Testers)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>All students should begin entering their in-person or virtual testing room in Teams by 6:50am.</b></li> <li>Testing rooms and locations will be shared on Monday, Oct. 26 in the Teams Eagles Nest course and in the Schoology Eagles Nest course</li> <li>On test day, students testing virtually will join their designated Teams channel in the Eagle's Nest Teams course.</li> </ul>  	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>For students testing virtually, students must have their camera on during the test administration. This is an important test security measure and mimics testing expectations across college campuses.</li> <li>Students without the camera on will receive a 50 for their Common Assessment and may face additional consequences as determined by the Dean of Students.</li> <li>Students with camera issues should notify their English teacher and <a href="#">complete this form</a>.</li> <li>During the test, students should turn off their incoming video to save bandwidth and reduce distractions.</li> </ul> <p>Choose More Options </p> <p>Choose "Turn off Incoming Video" </p>
