COVID-19 Updated Student/Parent Travel Policy

St. Andrew's Schools encourages the school community to avoid unnecessary travel. Should students travel off-island, they will be expected to fully comply with the State and County policies in place at the time of travel.

State of Hawai'i Policies

As of October 13, 2020: Fourteen Proclamation Related to the COVID-19 Emergency (excerpt)

Self-Quarantine for Travelers to the State: "Pursuant to section 127A-13(a)(1), HRS, all persons entering the State of Hawai'i shall be subject to mandatory self-quarantine as provided in the Travel Rules. The period of self-quarantine shall begin from the day of entry into the State and shall last 14 days or the duration of the person's presence in the State, whichever is shorter."

Self-Quarantine Exceptions: "The following persons entering the State shall not be subject to self-quarantine...(P)ersons who, upon entry into the State, provide written confirmation from a State approved COVID-19 testing facility of a negative test result from an observed test administered to the traveler within 72 hours from the final leg of departure. Persons under the age of five accompanied by a traveler who meets the negative test exception are not required to obtain a test prior to arrival. The negative test exception shall become effective on October 15, 2020."

Procedures for Student Travel

- Prior to travel, when travel plans have been confirmed, please email attendance@standrewsschools.org with the student's name, grade, travel departure and arrival dates, and expected first day back at school.
- After travel is complete, if a pre-flight COVID-19 test was taken, the student must provide documentation of a state-approved negative COVID-19 test to the School Nurse before being permitted to enter campus. Documentation can be presented to the School Nurse on the student's first day back to school during morning drop-off in front of the gym.
- If the student was unable to be tested within 72 hours of return travel, please email School Nurse, Ms. Colleen Treacy, at schoolnurse@standrewsschools.org to confirm the dates of the student's 14-day quarantine period.
- Students must continue to self-screen for COVID-19 symptoms and remain home if sick or not feeling well.
- If anyone in the student's household tests positive for the COVID-19 virus or learns that they were exposed to someone who tested positive for the virus, the student must stay home and contact the School Nurse as soon as possible.

This travel policy is subject to change at any time with updated government regulations.
