





The Big Picture With Fr. Bob



Dear Friends,

Once when visiting a nursing home, I overheard one of the residents say to a caregiver, "Is my mother here? I am looking for her." The caregiver replied, "No, I have not seen her yet. I will let you know when I do see her."

I inquired as to the age of the woman asking to see her mom. She is ninety

years old. The caregiver said it was very common for people with Alzheimer's to be asking to see family members. She said they do not remember which of their family members have already died.

I was touched by the elderly woman's desire to see her mom. We may forget many things when we get older, but we never forget our mother.

I know that many times when someone is near death, they call out for their mom. The person we begin our earthly journey with is also the person we long to have by our side when it draws to an end.

It is no surprise then that Jesus shared the gift of his mother with each of us. From the cross, he looked down at his mother and John, the beloved disciple. Jesus said to his mother, "Woman, this is your son." Then to the disciple he said, "This is your mother." And from that moment, the disciple made a place for her in his home. (John 19:26-27)

During the months of May and October, we remember Mary in a special way. Some people take time to say the rosary throughout the month of October. The rosary is a devotion that others make a part of their daily prayer time. If you intended to pray the rosary throughout the month of October but have not, start now.

The rosary is a tool for meditating on the life of Christ. We also reflect on Mary's response. Mary said "yes" to the invitation to be the Mother of God. She lived a holy and courageous life that can also inspire us to say "yes" to Jesus' invitation to follow him.

From the PAULpit



This weekend Jesus, the Word of God in the flesh, tells us about the most important part of the Word of God, that is, what is the greatest Law? What is that thing or that principle that should govern and direct our lives more than any other? If you remember last Sunday, the Pharisees tried

to trip Him up on the impossible question of taxes. This Sunday, Jesus is in another situation where He is tested again. Notice that Jesus gets tested a lot. This test is an attempt to lead Him down a rabbit hole and into a hair-splitting debate about the Mosaic Law. They could not bring Jesus down about taxes so now they want to bury Him in an unending argument.

Pharisees were the experts of the Scriptures and the Jewish Law. This pharisee thinks he has the chops to debate Jesus about which of the commandments is the greatest. And mind you, He is not talking about which of the 10 commandments is the greatest. In the Old Testament there are hundreds of commandments that regulated every aspect of Jewish life – from everyday stuff, to how to offer sacrifices in the Temple, and how to celebrate holy days. Which of these hundreds of laws is the most important is the question to Jesus. Our Lord's response comes from the book of Deuteronomy: You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. And while the Pharisee asked for only one commandment, Jesus adds a second because we always get more than we bargain for with God, and He quotes the Book of Leviticus, which Jesus says is equal to and inseparable from the first: You shall love your neighbor as yourself.

Love of God and love of neighbor go hand in hand. We have to have both. The temptation is to, unfortunately, compartmentalize love of God and love of neighbor. Sometimes in our lives it seems easier to love God and at other times, it seems easier to love our neighbor. I know I have had those experiences. But, as Jesus proclaims, these two loves cannot be separated because who is Jesus? Jesus is the union of God and man in His own person. Jesus is the Word made flesh, that is, these two commandments themselves together as one, with arms and legs.

Dear parishioners - It is with joy in our hearts that we share Divine Child resumed public Masses on Tuesday, May 19, 2020. In alignment with the liturgical directives issued by Archbishop Allen Vigneron, we are committed to providing a safe and clean environment for the faithful to worship our Lord. The health of our parishioners is of utmost importance to us and new procedures and protocols have been put in place to ensure this. Please review the information below regarding how Mass will work and the role we all play in keeping each other safe. Thank you in advance for your patience and cooperation as we work through our new "normal" together. Note: Dispensation from the Sunday obligation to attend Mass is granted to all faithful until Monday, Nov. 23, 2020. Let us keep each other in our prayers. - Fr. Bob McCabe

SECTION 1: WHO SHOULD ATTEND MASS

There is no age restriction for attending in-person Mass. It is up to each individual to decide what is best for them based on his or her particular circumstances. All are welcome! Space is limited and we cannot exceed 375 parishioners in the church at one time. This means we must count the number of attendees at each Mass, and we must turn attendees away when we reach capacity. We believe all people who desire to worship our Lord should have the ability to do so. See Section 2 for how we are working to ensure all can worship

INDOOR MASSES | We are returning to our normal weekday and weekend Mass schedule. All parishioners must enter the church through the front doors (Silvery Lane). Only 375 people will be admitted at once, and an attendant will be keeping count at the door. Attendees beyond that will be asked to proceed to the corresponding outdoor Mass at 10:15 AM or 12:45 PM, or to watch the weekend's streamed Mass.

OUTDOOR MASSES | Weather permitting, we added two outdoor Sunday Masses at 10:15AM & 12:45PM on the football field. Attendees may enter the football field through the gateway building, through the North-West gate from the elementary school lot, or through the South-East gate. Attendees will be seated on the field facing the home bleachers. Those who attend the outdoor Masses are encouraged to bring lawn chairs or a blanket. No seating will be provided. You may also consider bringing a hand -held umbrella for shade. Don't forget your sunscreen! Face-coverings are not required at outdoor Masses as long as social distancing is maintained. *Note: Outdoor Mass cancellations due to weather will be communicated to parishioners by 7AM via text, social media and email.

LIVE STREAMED MASS | For those unable to attend Mass in- person, the weekend live stream will continue, but it will be released Sunday at 10 AM. Look for a link to the Mass on the parish website.

SECTION 3: HOW MASS WILL WORK

FINDING A SEAT | To ensure proper social distancing and sanitizing of pews. parishioners will be asked to adhere to a seating chart for each Mass. Pews will be marked with alternating color coded letters. Please sit in these colored/lettered pews for the following Mass times. Attendants will also be present to assist parishioners.

WEEKDAY MASSES:

6:30 AM - Orange/A pews only 8:30 AM - Yellow/B pews only

SATURDAY MASSES:

8:30 AM - Orange/A pews only 4:30 PM - Yellow/B pews only

SUNDAY MASSES (Note changes): 8 AM - Orange/A pews only

10 AM - Yellow/B pews only 12:30 PM - Orange/A pews only

CONFESSIONS AVAILABLE Private confessions are held every Saturday from 2:30-4 PM and after the 4:30 PM Vigil Mass. All confessions are heard inside the church confessionals

OUTDOOR MASSES:

Please sit on or near the ten yard lines in order to provide adequate social distancing. Orange cones will be placed along each ten yard line to mark the amount of space to the front and back of attendees. <u>Those</u> who attend the outdoor Mass are encouraged to bring lawn chairs or a blanket. No seating will be provided. You may also consider bringing a handheld umbrella for shade. Face-coverings are not required at outdoor Masses as long as social distancing is maintained.

OFFERTORY | There will not be a collection during Mass. Upon the conclusion of Mass, please place your offertory in the collection baskets located in front of the altar, in the Gathering Space or at any exit of the football field. Alternatively, donations can be made online through FaithDirect.net, or mailed to/dropped off at the rectory (1055 N. Silvery Lane, Dearborn, MI 48128).

COMMUNION | A limited number of Eucharistic ministers will be on hand for each Mass to distribute Communion to multiple pew banks/yard lines. Thank you in advance for your patience as we expect Communion to take longer than usual. Communion procedures will be explained just before the reception of the Holy Eucharist. If you wish to receive the Eucharist, please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Attendees should maintain 6 feet of distance from other attendees while proceeding to the front of church/field.
- All attendees should remove masks and gloves as they approach the minister. No gloves may be worn when receiving the Eucharist in hand.
- Attendees should bow and reply "Amen" at a distance of 6 feet from the Eucharistic minister and then approach to receive the Eucharist.

For your safety, if a Eucharistic minister accidentally touches the hand or mouth of a parishioner, he or she will sanitize his or her hands instantly with rubbing alcohol at a sanitizing station located near each Eucharistic minister's station.

*If you are uncomfortable receiving the Eucharist at this time, please know that there is no obligation to receive the Eucharist whenever you come to Mass.

DIVINE CHILD RELICS

The Church dedicates the month of November to the Saints in heaven and the Holy Souls in Purgatory.

In honor of all saints, our parish relics, located in our Eucharistic Adoration Chapel, will be brought into the church for veneration.

The relics will be in the sanctuary of the church for veneration beginning on Saturday October 31, 4:30 pm Mass through the 12:30 pm Mass on November 1.

Why venerate the Saints?

All of us treasure things that have belonged to someone we love—a piece of clothing, another personal item, a lock of hair. Those "relics" remind us of the love we shared with that person while he or she was still living, even after death.

To venerate means to show deep respect for someone or something that is considered great or holy.

The Church strived to keep the use of relics in perspective. St. Jerome wrote in defense of relics: "We do not worship, we do not adore, for fear that we should bow down to the creature rather than to the Creator, but we venerate the relics of the saints in order to better adore Him, whose saints they are."

In all, relics remind us of **the holiness of a saint by their cooperation of God's work in them.** At the same time, relics inspire us to ask for the prayers of that saint to live the same kind of faith-filled life – **answering our call to holiness!**

- 1. Begin... Come, Holy Spirit
- Read (lectio): Read the Mass Bible passage. Read it carefully, two or three times. Let it really soak in. Underline a word or sentence that stands out to you.
- 3. Meditation (meditatio). Ponder the words of the passage that stood out to you. Allow yourself to be moved by the Word of God to discover its meaning for your life.
- 4. Prayer (oratio). Speak to God about the passage. Be yourself. Allow time for silence to let God speak back to you. In this prayerful engagement with the Bible passage, you open yourself up to the possibility of contemplation.
- 5. Contemplation (contemplatio): Resting in silence ask, "God, show me the way."

OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY

The Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary was celebrated on October 7th. Pope Pius V instituted this feast in 1571 but the backstory to Our Lady of the Rosary begins years earlier when the Pope worked with King Phillip II to strengthen the Holy League of Nations as Muslim military excursions became more common throughout the Mediterranean. In the spring of 1571, the Pope became convinced that conflict was imminent and he asked King Phillip II to appoint the King's half-brother, Don Juan of Austria, an illegitimate son of Emperor Charles V, Phillip's father, to develop and lead a naval force to confront the Muslim threat. Don Juan was an unconventional curious choice, to lead a navy as he had no direct naval experience that might suggest he was qualified. He was, however, an outstanding administrator and, more importantly, very charismatic. In today's parlance, he was a man's man. Don Juan threw himself into the task of building and equipping the holy League ships into an effective force. His greatest task may have been integrating the various navies of Spain, Venice, Genoa, Malta and the Papal States into a unified fleet.

As Juan was preparing the navy, our Holy Father was calling upon all Christendom to pray a novena as the fleet prepared for its fall departure. The fleet, compromising 210 ships, departed on October 7, 1571. It was Sunday and Mass was said throughout the fleet. As Mass concluded, a brigantine approached and reported that the Muslim fleet, too numerous to count, was approaching. Don Juan's simple response was, "That will save us the time of chasing after them." The Pope was praying the Rosary as the fleets met in the Gulf of Patras, Greece at Lepanto. The battle was a spectacular victory for the Christian navy and a complete, abject defeat for the Muslim navy. The Christian fleet totaled 210 ships of which we only lost 10. The Muslim fleet came in with 280 ships and lost over 180 ships – a defeat so complete and crushing that its supernatural origins could not be denied. Pope Pius V received what was surely the first divine text, turned to his secretaries and said, "Stop working, we have been handed a great victory." The Pope had no doubt of the origin of this victory and without hesitation attributed it to our Blessed Mother. He instituted a perpetual feast in her honor to be called, The Feast of Our Lady of Victory and it was celebrated as such until the liturgical reforms of Pope Paul VI in 1969 when it was changed to Our Lady of the Rosary.

This small painting, originally placed on the left of the altar of the Rosary in the church of St. Peter Martyr on Murano, is probably an ex-voto commissioned by Pietro Giustinian of Murano who took part in the naval battle at Lepanto on October 7th, 1571 when the Turkish fleet was defeated thanks mainly to the Venetian ships. The play of tone and light in the lower part depicting the battle is masterly. In the top part, above a curtain of cloud, the Saints Peter, Roch, Justine and Mark implore the Virgin to grant victory to the Christian fleet. In answer to this, an angel hurls burning arrows at the Turkish vessels.

RIVERVIEW — A chapel dedicated to Our Lady of Fatima in Riverview will be designated as an archdiocesan shrine in recognition of its special role as a place of pilgrimage and devotion in the life of the local Church, Archbishop Allen H. Vigneron announced October 6.

The Our Lady of Fatima Chapel in Riverview, which is under the care of the World Apostolate of Fatima's Detroit Archdiocesan Division, has helped people learn. live and spread the messages of Our Lady of Fatima since it was established in 2006.

"With its designation as an archdiocesan shrine, we recognize that Our Lady of Fatima Shrine will continue its service as a sacred place of pilgrimage, a source of devotion to Our Lady of Fatima, and a welcoming place for all the faithful seeking lives of peace and holiness," Archbishop Vigneron said.

In addition to regular Masses, Rosaries and devotions, the shrine features stained-glass windows and statuary depicting Our Lady of Fatima, as well as the adjacent St. Joseph Catholic Bookstore, which offers books, Catholic devotionals and resources to help people learn about the Blessed Mother and other Catholic topics.

By virtue of the chapel's being named a shrine, a plenary indulgence is available to the faithful who make a pilgrimage there on the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary of Fatima (October 13) or the feast of SS. Jacinta and Francisco Marto (February 20).

Anyone who visits the shrine throughout the year can receive a partial indulgence. The usual conditions for obtaining an indulgence include going to Mass, Confession and praying for the intentions of the pope.

Our Lady of Fatima Shrine is located at 18637 Ray Street in Riverview. Masses are celebrated three times per month:

- 7 p.m. on the first Friday of the month
- 8 a.m. on the first Saturday of the month
- 7 p.m. on the 13th of each month from May to October (if a Saturday or a Sunday, Mass is celebrated on the *preceding Friday*)

Confessions and Rosaries take place 30 minutes before first Friday and first Saturday Masses. The St. Joseph Bookstore is open Wednesdays and Saturdays from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m., during which time the chapel is open for private prayer with the Blessed Sacrament. 

Sprinkle the stuffing on top and drizzle butter over stuffing. Cover and cook on low 4 to 5 hours.

Meet Our Extended Family:

St. Peter of Alcantara (Feast Day October 26) 1499 – OCTOBER 18, 1562

Peter was born in Alcantara, Spain in 1499. His father was the governor of the province, and his mother came from a noble family. He was privately tutored and attended the University of Salamanca. After he returned home from university, he ioined the Franciscans. He went on to establish several friaries. When Peter was not preaching, he would spend long periods of time in solitude. He was known for frequently experiencing ecstasy, a state where he was entirely consumed with the warmth and light of the Holy Spirit. These euphoric moments were common during his prayer and meditation. Some claim to have witnessed him levitate. Peter served as a spiritual director and confessor to St. Teresa of Avila. It is said that he slept only 90 minutes each night; he is the patron saint of the Nocturnal Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.
