Position Title: Assistant/Associate/Full Professor, Public Health Program

Job Summary:

The successful candidate will become one of the inaugural principal faculty members of the public health program with anticipated enrollment beginning Fall 2021. The successful candidate will be a team-oriented public health professional who can contribute to (a) defining program outcomes, (b) curricular design, (c) preparing accreditation efforts, and ultimately (d) teach a variety of undergraduate and graduate public health courses. Further, the successful candidate will engage in scholarship activities, advise students, facilitate community engagement with partners, and provide service to the university and profession. Academic rank and salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. While the posting is for a full-time position, part-time arrangements may be considered at the candidate's request.

The Public Health Program at Wingate University will offer degree programs for a Bachelor of Science in Public Health (BSPH) and Master of Public Health (MPH). The program will also offer unique degree tracks including a 4 +1 year BSPH + MPH degree and dual MPH degree options with existing WU health science graduate programs. Accreditation efforts are underway to facilitate a Fall 2021 enrollment date for both the BSPH and MPH degree programs. The MPH will be facilitated via an online platform increasing student flexibility and opportunities.

Qualifications and Experience:

- Master's or Doctoral degree in public health, health education or a closely-related field at time of effective date of appointment required
- Evidence of successful college teaching experience in a public health, health education or closely-related curriculum required.
- Evidence of successful community engagement, including the ability to foster formal partnerships with health-related organizations required.

- Demonstrated potential to develop a research initiative in a public health discipline required.
- Demonstrated potential to provide on-going service to the program, community, university and profession required.
- Doctoral degree in public health, or a Master's degree in public health with a Doctorate health science degree (e.g., MD, PharmD, DPT, etc.) preferred.
- Experience with public health curricular design and accreditation efforts preferred.
- Demonstrated ability to work collaboratively within academia preferred.
- Experience with facilitating online education preferred.
- Successful research and grant activity preferred.
- Previous public health/health education work experience preferred.
- Credentialed in CHES, MCHES and/or CPH preferred.
- Previous healthcare management experience preferred.
