<p>Create a review for one of your favourite books or stories. You could present this in any way you choose.</p>	<p>Set a personal goal to have achieved by the end of this term. It could be to try something new or develop something you can already do. Show how you are working towards achieving your goal.</p>	<p>Make a shadow puppet. Can you create a performance with your puppet? Perhaps you could film this to make your own movie.</p>
<p>Create a piece of artwork inspired by water.</p>	<p>Learn your number bonds to 20 until you are fluent (without using your fingers!)</p>	<p>Research the water cycle. You can present your research in any way that you choose – this could even be a 3D model.</p>
<p>Write a short story about a character that is lost at sea or stranded on a desert island. Think about what they might need to survive. You could type or handwrite your work. Think about including illustrations.</p>	<p>Write a diary in the role of a raindrop (think about the journey that you would take through the water cycle).</p>	<p>Find a poem you like and practice performing it – this could be by acting it out, using different voices or reading it. You could perform this at school or create a video of your performance.</p>
<p>Create a poem inspired by fireworks or the season of winter.</p>	<p>Investigate shadows. What happens when you move closer or further away from the light source?</p>	<p>Learn a new times table. You could prepare a song or rap to help you remember it. The rest of the class could learn this too.</p>
