#### Groundbreaking on Gym and Performing Arts Center

Imagine if you had had the opportunity to perform the all-school musical on a stage with professional grade lighting and sound where you could be seen by every audience member. Imagine a space where you could gain valuable technical skills behind the scenes. Imagine playing basketball or volleyball on a regulation-sized basketball court or hosting home games for visiting teams.

These visions are becoming a reality for current and future students with Countryside's new gym and performing arts space. This new facility will provide our students and teachers with the opportunities to grow and be challenged in new ways that will strengthen the education of every child.

Learning teamwork, gaining confidence and exhibiting good sportsmanship are important components of a Countryside education. Some of the possibilities we will gain with a new gym include: Hosting home games and even tournaments; exploring game concepts more fully with more space; providing opportunities for more students to play instead of sitting on the sidelines waiting their turn; attaining new fitness goals during the winter months; providing our Extended Day students with a permanent home in the multi-purpose room.

The arts, performing and visual, are central to a Countryside education. With a new stage our students will receive the full benefits of the performing experience. Sophisticated

lighting and sound equipment will allow interested students the opportunity to gain valuable behind-the-scenes technical training. A dedicated stage will allow our young performers to master a full range of performing skills and will allow the audience to have a more authentic and pleasurable viewing experience.

Early donors gave a powerful vote of confidence on both the priorities and the ambitious scope of this project by committing close to \$2 million toward our goal. The gym and performing arts center will cost \$4.5 million to complete. After prudent analysis, the board of directors has elected to finance a portion of the project which leaves roughly \$1 million still to raise.

Current funding will allow us to build the structure, but to fully outfit both the gym and the stage and to deliver the facility that fulfills our vision, we must raise more money through charitable giving. Gifts to this campaign will make a profound difference in the life of Countryside and the lives of our children.

We hope that if you are in the neighborhood, you will stop by and see our construction in progress. Be sure to also check our website for regular updates. #### **Great News from the Past Year**

We broke ground on our new Gym and Performing Arts Center in April!

Our choruses, band, and ensemble groups performed their concerts at U of I's Smith Memorial Hall and University Christian Church with a CD produced of the winter concert.

The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Poster, Poetry and Prose Contest honored fifth graders Elizabeth, Sam, Emma & Grace.

Fifth grader Anshul and second grader Harrison were named Warren Junior Chess Scholars - an award given to only 35 chess players in Illinois.

Our MathCounts team took 2nd place in regional competition. In individual competition, seventh grader Lyle placed 1st and eighth grader Justin was the Countdown Round winner. At State our team placed 9th.

Fifth grade pianist Grace won 3rd place in the junior division of the 11th Annual Sigma Alpha lota Solo Competition. This competition is open to all instrumentalists in grades 5-8.

The Countryside Trio (eighth graders Pierre and Jordan and fifth grader Grace) won 2nd in the DOCHA chamber music competition. Pierre's other trio, Eclipse, won 1st place.

Countryside welcomed new teachers: middle school LWW teacher and parent, Chris Antonsen, and third grade teacher, Caren Allen.

The Champaign-Urbana Optimist Club honored three fifth graders with Challenge Awards: Anshul in Science, Grace in Arts, and Raya in Community Service.

Both our Odyssey of the Mind teams placed 1st at State and advance to World competition. This is the sixth consecutive year we have competed at Worlds!

The All-School Art Show "River Walk on the River Seine" had its grand opening at the Orpheum Children's Museum in April, complete with French inspired theme and foods.

Countryside began an afterschool Math Olympiad club for grades 4-6. The biennial International Dinner was held at the Urbana Country Club. Celebrating our cultural diversity, the event featured food from around the world and tango lessons.

## Former Faculty Updates

#### Annie Wiseman-Floyd - French

Although I left Countryside in 2003 when our family moved to North Carolina, I kept many wonderful memories of my French students K-8, at Countryside. I remember sitting on a breakout room floor with some rambunctious learners playing games, singing songs, writing commercials, memorizing poetry, rehearsing plays - anything and everything to get them to speak French! They spoke beautifully and I hope they still are!

We had 4 great years in NC before moving to the Dominican Republic and Haiti in 2007 to work mostly with vulnerable and orphaned children. We learned by observing others that often when trying to help people go forward, especially poor people, you can actually prevent them from making progress. This mainly occurs when people throw money at a problem or do a job for someone that they can and should do themselves. We learned that one of the best ways to help Haiti is to provide better education for children (50% of whom do not have the luxury of attending school). So after 3 years there and one year back in NC (for a sabbatical), we will soon be returning to start a small, progressive Christian School in Carrefour (an area in Port au Prince). Two of Haiti's greatest assets are children and their thirst to learn. We will offer an education that is relevant to real life there and is stunningly creative.

You cannot imagine how often I recall my teaching experience at Countryside and my former students. The work there helped prepare me to teach children in Haiti and the DR who do not "wiggle" as much you all did but who nonetheless inspire me! Countryside's simple motto of joy in learning and excellence in education remains my mantra!
