

## JIM RIORDAN '67 WHO'S WHO LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

James Riordan '67. a nationally-known author, was awarded the 2019 Who's Who Lifetime Achievement Award in the Writing Category. The Albert Nelson Marquis Lifetime Achievement Award is an honor reserved



for biographers who have demonstrated leadership, excellence and longevity within their respective industries and professions.

Marguis Who's Who has remained the standard for reliable and comprehensive biographical data since 1899. The Who's Who Lifetime Achievement recognizes individuals who have achieved excellence in the industry and have excelled in their field for at least 20 years.

James is the author of 45 published books, including the New York Times Bestseller. Break on Through: The Life & Death of Jim Morrison, upon which filmmaker Oliver Stone based his movie The Doors. He also wrote Stone's biography.

James' first book was The Platinum Rainbow (written with Bob Monaco). It was called "One of the best how-to books ever written" by the Los Angeles Daily News and "The ultimate career book on the music industry" by Recording, Engineer & Producer. Other notable works in his literary repertoire include The Bishop of Rwanda (written with John Rucvahana) and his solo work The Coming of the Walrus.

His career began in the music industry where, as a songwriter, manager, producer and concert promoter, he worked with several well-known artists. In 1976, he began writing a newspaper column on popular music, "Rock-Pop," which he later syndicated. Riordan became one of America's premier rock journalists with articles reaching millions of readers to include those in Rolling Stone, Crawdaddy, Circus, Musician, and newspapers such as The Chicago Daily News and The Kansas City Star.

On April 9, 2000, his 16-year-old son, Jeremiah, was killed as a passenger in

an accident that involved three drunk drivers. Shortly after this, James founded

Make it Stick, which works to warn teens of the dangers of substance abuse.

Since 2012, Riordan, through Make it Stick, had produced the Kankakee Area

Music Awards, which recognizes talent within a 25-mile radius of Kankakee. In

In November 2019, Adam Turner '07 and his coach. John O'Connor, made the 4.600 mile trip to Pabianice. Poland, for the 2019 Mas World Cup. Mas wrestling, or stick wrestling, is a traditional wrestling sport that originated in Russia. To compete, two wrestlers sit opposite of each other and try to pull a stick out of the other opponent's hands or drag their opponent over the wooden divider. While brute strength is a big part of the sport, so is technique, speed, and agility. Competitors are allowed to move up the board, twist, turn and move their feet.

The tug-of-war matches

last from mere seconds up Adam Turner '07 with coach, John O'Connor to the 2-minute time limit, and end whenever one athlete lets go of the stick. Victory goes to the athlete who pulls his opponent over the board and keeps the stick in his hands.

The Mas World Cup is held every other year. The event Adam competed in included athletes from Russia, eastern Europe, Austria, Germany, and Poland where the event was hosted.

The competition is done by weight classes and at this competition, the top three winners walked away with medals and prizes. Adam made it to the 4th round and was ultimately beat-out for the bronze medal. He only learned about the sport roughly two years ago and is now ranked in the top 10 in the world for his weight class. Adam will be competing in Las Vegas in December at the 2020 Olympia World MAS Wrestling Tournament.

Adam is a Correctional Sergeant for Chain O'Lakes Correctional Facility in Indiana. He has also been involved in Strongman competitions for the past five years. While at Bishop McNamara, Adam played football and wrestled. He went on to play football for Marion University in Indianapolis. He currently lives in Kendalville, IN with his wife, Skyla, and their two daughters, Maleigha and Rosalie.

Khadaizha Sanders '15 at Rutgers University

In May 2020, The Big Ten announced Khadaizha Sanders '15 of the Rutgers University Women's Basketball Team as one of the Outstanding Sportsmanship Award winners for the 2019-20 academic year. One member of each varsity sports team on every campus in The Big Ten was chosen by his or her institution as a Sportsmanship Award honoree and two Outstanding Sportsmanship Award winners were then selected from each institution. All of the Sportsmanship Award winners distinguished themselves through sportsmanship and ethical behavior. The honorees must also be in good academic standing and must have demonstrated good citizenship outside of the sports competition setting. Twenty-eight standouts were chosen from a group of 270 students who displayed positive sportsmanship throughout the academic year.

In addition, Khadaizha is a three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection and one of just ten guards in Rutgers women's basketball history to record 400 or more assists for a career. Her Rutgers career totals were 764 career points and 421 assists in a 124-game career.

During her senior year at Bishop McNamara, Khadaizha "KK," led the girls' basketball team to the 2015 IHSA Class 2A State Championship title at Redbird Arena in Bloomington, Illinois which was the first championship title ever in school history.





#### **IOHATHAN RAICHE '03** 40 UNDER 40 WINNER IN ST. LOUIS

Kirkwood, Missouri Citv Planner, Jonathan Raiche '03, was selected by the St. Louis Business Journal as a "40 Under 40" recipient for 2019. An award dinner was held on February 13, 2020 at the Chase Park Plaza Hotel in St. Louis.

During his tenure as City Planner, Jonathan spearheaded the city's planning



project "EnVision 2035: Comprehensive Plan" that resulted in the development of a downtown master plan for the city's robust and historic downtown business district. He has also worked closely with the Kirkwood Des Peres Area Chamber on its economic development team and on the "Kirkwood Open for Business" City-Business Community partnership. Jonathan also researched and developed a new online data tool to help local businesses find information such as demographics, real estate listings, labor force and education data, consumer spending, and geographic mapping.

Jonathan has been instrumental in several economic development projects where the city partnered with the Kirkwood Des Peres Area Chamber, Trailnet, Great Rivers Greenway, and other organizations. Currently, he serves on a team with elected officials, community members, and a consultant evaluating and updating the city's codes for zoning, subdivisions, signs, and architectural review.

After graduating from Bishop McNamara, Jonathan attended the University of Illinois in Champaign. In 2007, he received a Bachelor of Arts degree in urban planning and in 2008 a master's degree in urban planning. He and his wife, Chelsea, have three daughters and live in Ellisville, Missouri.

Together with the monks of St. Procopius Abbey, he ministers to the faculty, staff and students of Benet with sacraments, retreats, mission trips and pilgrimages.


