The total sum of Trevor's grants and scholarships from the many programs he has been accepted to is \$267,600; these are both academic and athletic scholarships. He has been a part of the varsity wrestling team for all four years and has 98 career wins. He is a two-year co-captain, an Adidas All-American, and a State Qualifier in wrestling. He is also a two-year member of the National Honor Society. Community Service is also important to Trevor. He has documented over 650 hours of service, including seven mission trips and many hours volunteering at the ReStart homeless shelter. While at Center, Kathryn has earned at least 9 college credits (pending AP test results) and has been in the top 10% of her class every year. She has been thoroughly involved during her time in high school and has held many leadership positions with aplomb: National Honor Society President, Student Government Association Treasurer, captain of the girls' tennis team, woodwinds section captain, and CHS Book Club President. Outside of the classroom Kathryn has dedicated much of her time to serving others and has been a Children's Mercy Student Volunteer throughout her high school years.
