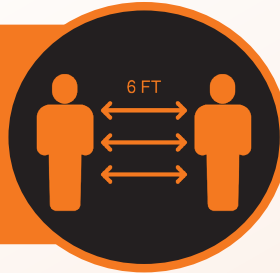




Those handing out candy should use a platter instead of a bowl and consider leaving “grab and go” treats outside to limit contact.

Bring hand sanitizer with you and wash your hands immediately upon returning home.

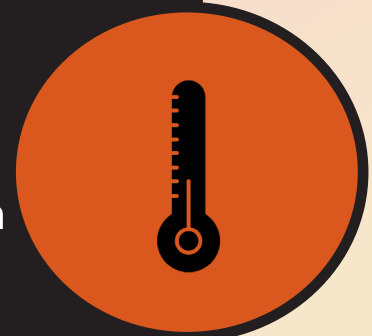
# HALLOWEEN IN BROCKTON
