

Financial aid consists of funds provided to students and families to help pay for postsecondary educational expenses. Some aid needs to be paid back or earned, and some aid is a gift.








What Application should the student complete????

Every student who is eligible to complete a FAFSA – Free Application for Federal Student Aid

CSS Profile Application – if college(s) student is apply to uses/requires

MSFAA – Maryland State Financial Aid Application - for students who are not eligible to fill out a FAFSA

CSS Profile Form — www. cssprofile.org Used by approximately 400 colleges for nonfederal aid — Available October 1, 2020



2020-2021 FAFSA

- fall 2020, spring 2021, summer 2021

2021-2022 FAFSA – available October 1, 2020

-summer 2021, fall 2021, spring 2022

*** Check with college you plan to attend to see which FAFSA is used for summer

FSAID

- Sign FAFSA electronically
- Not required, but speeds up processing
- May be used by students and parents throughout aid process, including subsequent school year
- Only the owner should create a FSA ID

Create a New FSA ID

An FSA ID is a username and password that gives you access to Federal Student Aid's online systems and can serve as your legal signature.

Only create an FSA ID using your own personal information and for your own exclusive use. You are not authorized to create an FSA ID on behalf of someone else, including a family member.


You are not allowed to have an employee or agent of a commercial entity, or other third party, create an FSA ID for you for any purposes including but not limited to: payment reductions, debt consolidation or applying for aid. Misrepresentation of your identity to the federal government could result in criminal or civil penalties.

Important: When you are done, select the CANCEL button to clear your data even if you did not finish creating your FSA ID. Just closing your browser window or going to another website may not be enough to prevent other people using this computer from seeing your information until the session expires.



IRS Data Retrieval Tool

- While completing FOTW, applicant may submit real-time request to IRS for tax data
- IRS will authenticate taxpayer's identity
- If match found, IRS sends real-time results to applicant in new browser window
- Applicant chooses whether or not to transfer data to FOTW
- Reduces documents requested by financial aid offices

Making Corrections


If necessary, corrections to FAFSA data may be made by:

- Using FAFSA on the Web (<u>www.fafsa.gov</u>) if student has a FSA ID;
- Updating paper SAR (SAR Information Acknowledgement cannot be used to make corrections); or
- Submitting documentation to college's financial aid office

What is Verification?

- Verification Groups
 - Income AGI student and parent
 - U.S. Income tax paid student and parent
 - Untaxed IRA distributions and IRA deductions and payments
 - Tax exempt interest income
 - Education Credits
 - Number of household members/number in college
 - High school completion
 - Identity/Statement of Educational Purpose

Special Circumstances

- Cannot be documented using FAFSA
- Send written explanation and documentation to financial aid office at each college
- College will review and request additional information if necessary
- Decisions are final and cannot be appealed to U.S. Department of Education

Direct Student Loans (Subsidized and Unsubsidized)

- Subsidized: Based on demonstrated financial "need" (as per the FAFSA EFC) and no interest accrues during enrollment
- Unsubsidized: Interest accrues during enrollment
- Base annual loan limits (combined subsidized and unsubsidized)
 - \$5,500 for 1st year undergraduates (only \$3,500 can be subsidized)
 - \$6,500 for 2nd year undergraduates (only \$4,500 can be subsidized)

Current interest rate – 2.75% - will change 7/1/21

PLUS Loans

- Borrowers are parents of dependent undergraduate students
- Annual loan limit: cost of attendance minus other aid
- Current interest rate 5.3% will change 7/1/21
- Parents can request deferment while the student is in college
- If the deferment is not requested, payments will begin when the loan is fully paid out (spring semester)

Alternative Loans

•Option to research

 Should only be applied for after all sources of federal financial aid have been exhausted





Student Guide to Higher Education & Financial Aid in Maryland

The Promise Scholarship creates opportunities for students to attend one of Maryland's public community colleges by providing tuition assistance for any student eligible for in-state tuition.

Who May Apply:

An individual may be eligible for a Promise Scholarship if the student:

- Graduated from high school or successfully completed a GED in the State within two years of applying for the scholarship; and
- Enrolls in a public community college as a candidate in a credit-bearing vocational certificate, a creditbearing certificate, or an associate degree program.

(According to Education Article §§ 18-3401 - 18-3407 of the Annotated Code of Maryland.)

How to Apply:

An individual must:

 Submit a completed Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at https://studentaid.ed.gov/sa/fafsa or submit the Maryland State Financial Aid Application (MSFAA) online through MDCAPS for any applicant who is ineligible to receive federal aid but is eligible for instate tuition by March 1, 2020;

What is Expected Family Contribution (EFC)?


- Amount family can reasonably be expected to contribute
- Stays the same regardless of college
- Two components
 - Parent contribution
 - Student contribution
- Calculated using data from a federal application form and a federal formula

Definition of Need

Cost of Attendance (COA) – Expected Family Contribution (EFC)

= Financial Need

Need Varies Based on Cost

Colleges and Universities

Award aid on the basis of both merit and need

Aid may be gift aid or self-help aid

Use information from the FAFSA and/or institutional applications

Deadlines and application requirements vary by institution

Financial Aid Award Letters

- The financial aid award letter outlines the details of the financial aid package the student is offered
- Specific to that college/university
- Usually for one academic year
- Review how much the student is offered and look at how much is grants and scholarships vs. loans
- Terms and conditions of awards
- Look at what the final costs is (remember this is per year)

You don't know what you don't know.....

- Research
- Ask questions
- Read everything the student receives
