

Scholarship Information

The following information provided is designed to assist you with finding sources for local scholarships. You may view this document on the Lompoc High School website, click on the Counseling tab on the home page, then Scholarships, and then Local Scholarship Information or you can access it in the **Senior Class Google Classroom**, under **Classwork** and then click on **LOCAL SCHOLARSHIP**, and then save a copy to your computer.

Please read thoroughly to verify you meet the requirements for the scholarships listed.

Highlight those to begin the process. Once you have identified the scholarships for which you intend to apply, use the chart on the last page of the packet to list them for your convenience. Do not apply for a scholarship unless you meet the requirements listed for that scholarship.

When a local scholarship is received in the counseling office, it will then be posted to the Senior Google Classroom and the LHS website. Not all the scholarships become available at the same time, so it is important to check back frequently for additional applications and information.

Please keep in mind that the information presented is compiled prior to the start of the school year and some items may have changed or they may be updated in the future to reflect the current status of a scholarship. This document contains scholarships that were offered last year and **may** be offered again this year. The key is to check the google classroom and/or the LHS website on a regular basis to see if the scholarship is now available. After you have identified the scholarships for which you intend to apply, and they have become available in the google classroom/LHS website, click on the scholarship link and follow the instructions on how to complete the application.

To make the application process easier, many local organizations use the **LHS “Common Scholarship Application”**. You will find the application in the Google Classroom and on the website. Once you have made a copy of the application, you will fill out the form and save it. When you are applying for a scholarship that uses the common application, simply change the name of the scholarship at the top of the page before submitting the application.

You will also need to submit an essay with every application that uses the “Common Scholarship Application”. The link to the writing prompt for the essay is located under the link for the Common Scholarship “Common Application Writing Prompt” on the Lompoc High webpage and in the google classroom. **Always remember to enter the name of the scholarship at the top on the Common Scholarship Application, attach your essay and save a copy.**

Keep in mind that not all local organizations use the Common Scholarship Application. If an organization uses their own scholarship application, include with the instructions in the link provided on the website/google classroom.

Make sure to read and follow the scholarship application instructions carefully. Some scholarships request supplemental materials (ex. letters of recommendation, transcript, test scores etc.). Make sure that you attach this information to your scholarship application. If you need help or have questions, please let your counselor know and they will help answer your questions.

Once you have completed the application, you will need to follow the instructions carefully regarding the submission of your application and materials. Please pay close attention to the submission instructions and scholarship deadlines. Late or incomplete applications will not be accepted. Again, if you have questions, do not hesitate to ask for help.

When requesting a letter of recommendation from a teacher or other staff member (Coach, Counselor, etc), please make sure to give them an advance notice of at least two weeks' prior to the due date. In addition, you will want to provide your recommender with a copy of your resume and autobiographical essay.

If asked to submit an "Official Transcript", please email the registrar at Lompoc High School with your request. It will take approximately 24 hours to complete your request, for this reason it is a good idea to request extras to have on hand. **Do not** open the official transcript envelope once you have picked it up. Submit the transcript in the sealed envelope you receive from the registrar. If the word "official" is not in front of the word transcript on the info sheet or application, you may use an unofficial transcript. You can request an unofficial transcript from your counselor. Once completed, the transcript will be emailed back to you.

Please be aware of scholarship scams online. If you are suspicious of a scholarship opportunity, please check with your counselor to see if it is a legitimate scholarship offering before providing **any** personal information.

- May only be used at a 4 year college or university
- Strong background in Math and Science Skills is desirable

American G.I. Forum:

- High School Senior of Mexican/Mexican American Heritage (mother, father or both)
- Must plan to attend college

Art Vargas Jr. Memorial – (LHS Common Application)

- Must have attended LHS all four (4) years and have a GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Attend any type of post-secondary education

AURO Wealth Management - (LHS Common Application)

- Graduating senior who has a 2.0 GPA or higher
- Must have participated in a sport, volunteer or community service
- Student must attend a two or four year school
- LHS common application and Essay

Beta-Pi Sigma Sorority Lambda Chapter

- Female Senior
- 3.0 GPA or higher
- *Not offered again until 2021*

Breitling Scholarship Visit Award

- Scholarship funds are for travel to Out-Of-State colleges
- Female Junior or Senior
- Citizen or Legal permanent resident
- Deadline November 30, 2019

Brice Fabing Memorial Athletic Scholarship – (LHS Common Application)

- Must have participated in athletics at LHS. This includes all sports, Cheer and Dance.
- You must also have participated in a community event such as Relay for Life, Flower Festival, etc.

Catherine D. LaRue Memorial Musical Theatre Scholarship – (LHS Common Application)

- Must intend to major in Theater or Music

- Female high school senior planning on pursuing a degree in education at an accredited college or university.

- Open to all LHS seniors must include an official transcript

- Graduating senior from LHS residing in the Lompoc Valley for at least 2 years

- U.S. Citizen or Permanent Resident
- Attended Lompoc High All 4 Years
- 3.0 cumulative GPA or higher
- Involved in at least 2 extra-curricular activities in school or the community
- Must have satisfactory citizenship and attendance

- Must be the student of an active or retired military family residing within Northern Santa Barbara County.
- Must have a valid military ID card
- Scholarship must be used at a 4 year college or university
- Involvement in school and community
- Financial need is not considered

- Must be majoring in an agriculture related major.
- 2 yr. or 4 yr. schools acceptable
- Must be SB County resident
- Will require letters of recommendation and transcript

Santa Barbara County Vintner's Foundation

- Planning to study Viticulture of Enology at Allan Hancock College

Santa Maria Valley Contractors Association

- Majoring in anything construction related, apprentice program or Union Trade School
