Billie- I have a few questions for you about the illegal drag racing that has been going on in the Minneapolis area.

Officer Kiel- Let's get started!

Billie- When did this drag racing first get big?

Officer Kiel- The popularity has increased over the years, I'd say we're looking at probably all the way back to 2001-2002 with the dawn of the Fast and Furious movie franchise. With the dawn of social media and the ability to reach a broad audience instantly, it started to kick up within the last 5-6 years.

Billie- Have you been directly involved in stopping any of the racers?

Officer Kiel- Oh, absolutely, every single weekend.

Billie- Where have you noticed this racing is happening the most? Officer Kiel- That I can see visibly, I see it happening on Walnut Street in Roseville, Highway 280, in Lauderdale, Industrial Boulevard in Minneapolis, and there's a spot off of Kasota street in Minneapolis, just west of 280.

Billie- Is this drag racing a seasonal activity, spiking up during a certain month or season?

Officer Kiel- Yes, so we expect to see it after the first good, healthy rainfall in the springtime, once the salt and the sand gets washed off the roads, and we'll see it until typically the first freeze. I think a lot of it also has to do with the school calendar, so I think this last season was a bit longer because school hasn't been in session for so long. Personally, I'm seeing people at traffic stops getting younger and younger, 15, 16, 17 years old, and still in high school. Billie- Wow! Are most of the racers local or are more from far away?

Officer Kiel- I'd say it's from all over. I've stopped people from as far out as Lindstrom, I stopped a kid from Preston, Eau Claire Wisconsin. I'd say within a 1-2 hour drive from the cities. It's mostly twin cities people.

Billie- How are the drag racers organized?

Officer Kiel- Social Media. It's all social media-based. There are secret groups, and they use different social media. Kick, Instagram, Facebook, Snapchat. People can reach a very vast audience almost instantaneously. Billie- Interesting! What are the dangerous aspects of drag racing?

Officer Kiel- Well, first of all, it is cars that are not built to be raced, and they are using things that make the cars go way too fast. And the roads are not built to be driven on that fast, these roads are designed for a certain speed, amount of traffic on them, so we've got a roadway that is designed to be driven on at 30 miles per hour, and we've got cars going 60-70 miles per hour on them. President Trump's Covid-19 Care and Treatment

On Sept. 31, at 1 AM, President Trump Tweeted that The First Lady and him had tested positive for Covid-19. Friday morning President Trump's White House chief of staff, Mark Meadows told reporters that President Trump had "mild symptoms." Also that morning Melania Trump tweeted that she had mild symptoms, but overall was feeling good. That afternoon the White House said that President Trump received a dose of Regeneron, the experimental drug that has shown promising results improving coronavirus symptoms. A little after 6 PM ET, President Trump left the White House via helicopter headed for Walter Reed Medical Center. Trump gave reporters a thumbs up as he walked to Marine One.

Dr. Sean Conley, physician to President Trump and doctors at Walter Reed briefed the press Saturday morning. They said "They Trump's fatigue and mild cough were improving"Dr. Conley also said "Trump had been fever free for 24 hours." Later Mark Meadows, a White House Official said "The president's vitals over the last 24 hours were very concerning and the next 48 hours will be critical in terms of his care. We're still not on a clear path to a full recovery." Conley addressed the conflicting comments between him and Mark Meadows on Saturday, saying the chief of staff's comments were "misconstrued." and "What he meant was that 24 hours ago, when he and I were checking on the president, that there was that momentary episode of the high fever and that temporary drop in the saturation, which prompted us to act expediently to move him up here," Conley said.

A while later Trump Tweeted that he was feeling well and thanked the doctors and nurses at Walter Reed Medical Center.

Dr. Conley and doctors at Walter Reed briefed the press again Sunday morning, sharing that Trump experienced two drops in his oxygen levels: one Friday and again Saturday. Conley said Trump had a high fever and saw his oxygen levels fall while at the White House on Friday morning ahead of being moved to Walter Reed. The medical team talked about the President's medical plan, which includes the steroid dexamethasone, Trump received the first dose on Saturday, along with a five-day treatment plan of remdesivir."If he continues to look and feel as well as he does today our hope is that we can plan for a discharge as early as tomorrow to the White House where he can continue his treatment course," Dr. Brian Garibaldi said.

Trump Tweeted on Monday that he would be leaving Walter Reed Medical Center At 6:30 PM ET and his doctors confirmed it in the press briefing. Dr. Conley said that while Trump may not be "entirely out of the woods yet," he believes he is ready to get his care at the White House. Dr. Conley also said "He's returning to a facility, the White House medical unit, that's staffed 24/7: top notch physicians, nurses, PAs, logisticians, and the unit here...is going to continue to support us in that nature." Dr. Garibaldi said "The medical team had made plans for Trump to receive the fifth and final dose of remdesivir at the White House Tuesday night."

Signs of Life CON'T

Imagine an earth size planet, scorching hot and the brightest thing in the night sky, whose clouds are full of what is essentially poison. It's completely barren, with no chance of supporting life. *Or so we thought*.

On September 14th, a team of astronomers found phosphine, a colorless, smelly, and highly flammable gas, in Venus' atmosphere. This finding is exciting because on exoplanets (for example, Venus), phosphine indicates an ecosystem without free oxygen. On exoplanets, no known process creates detectable amounts of phosphine, so the only explanation is that there must be life in the Venus atmosphere.

Venus has been ignored by NASA for many, many years because of it's 900+ degree temperatures, lack of water, and the fact that it just doesn't appeal as much as other planets. We have planetary neighbors that NASA has been investigating instead. Mars has its atmosphere and it's -80 to 45-degree temperatures. Triton (one of Jupiter's many moons) has the possibility of an ocean. Venus has just stayed in the shadows for such a long time, but now that scientists have had breakthrough discoveries, they are starting to question how much they have overlooked. According to the NASA website, "Venus' extreme temperatures and acidic clouds make it an unlikely place for life as we know it." The website was last updated in January, which explains why it contradicts recent findings. It is a great reminder that what seems impossible can happen.

About 700 million years ago, when the earth was covered with ice, Venus was earth like. In September of 2019, a study concluded that Venus may have once had surface water and a habitable condition. That possibility also came with the possibility of life, although it was a small possibility. If there was once life on Venus, could that life have stayed in microbial form, high in the atmosphere? Nobody knows the answer.

If we want to answer that question, we will need to take future action. Because this is only a *possibility* of life, NASA is wary of sending a rover or a probe to gather more information. Right now, NASA is deciding between four space missions to fund, two of which would go to Venus. The first is "Veritas", a probe that would be sent to Venus to explore the surface; similarly, "DaVinci+" would send a probe through the Venus atmosphere to understand the history of Venus' water, along with sending pictures of the surface back to Earth. The third option would be "Trident", which would be sent to one of Neptune's large moons with a possible subsurface ocean to learn more about it. The final option would be "IVO", a probe sent to one of Jupiter's largest moons to explore Volcanoes. All of these options are intriguing, but if we want to learn more about Venus, we need to send a probe there.

What a crazy world we live in! First, a pandemic, and now, possible life in space! 2020 has given us all sorts of burdens and possibilities, but in the words of Sara Seager, a planetary scientist, "This is an astonishing and 'out of the blue' finding, It will definitely fuel more research into the possibilities for life in Venus's atmosphere." Hopefully, we can take that possibility and send a probe to Venus soon.




