Rules of Order	• Robert's Rules of Order were reviewed and explained.
Voting for Chair, Vice-Chair and Secretary	 Maude Beckman was nominated and unanimously elected as Chair for the 2020-21 School year. (10-0) Aaron Holbrook was nominated and elected as Vice-Chair for the year. (10-0) Greg Mudrow was nominated and elected as Secretary for the year. (10-0)
Meeting Dates/Times Vote.	 The current meeting time of 7:15 A.M. on the second Tuesday of each month was discussed. Keeping the current day and time was motioned and approved with a vote of 10-0.
School Improvement Plan and Financial Update	 Dr. Poll reviewed the School Improvement Plan (link to state site found on the school website under the Community Council tab). Wording of Goal #1 was changed to read at least 95% of students will leave NDJH on track for graduation (from less than 5% of students will be credit deficient) Spending of \$60,000 was reviewed and discussed (Cloudbooks purchased, professional development arranged, and teacher productivities purchased.) Goal #2 was reviewed and discussed. There will be less data available this year as there were no end of level test last year. Most the money budgeted for this goal goes to faculty and staff salaries. Goal #3 was reviewed. Expectations were discussed and it was emphasized that growth was the key indicator. Funding goes to class supplies and library resources. School funding could be impacted by students moving to Davis Connect. Roughly 80-90 students have transferred to the online option. Dr. Poll reviewed counseling centers flexibility when it comes to meeting specific needs of students and parents.

Counseling Department	 Addition of new counselor (Mike Bradfield) to NDJH was reviewed. Counseling department is trying not to call students out of classes as current class time is valuable.
After-School Program	 Mr. Brown reviewed the After-School Program with the Council. Enrollment has been down to start the school year (due to the current circumstances and scheduling) Funding has also decreased resulting in the elimination of the 4:00 P.M. bus. There is still a 6:00 bus to get students home after school. After-School tutoring is still offered each day. There is no charge for the program and college tutors are currently meeting the needs of students. The admin assured the council that teachers would help if the demand increased.

Library	 Books are currently being ordered online by students and delivered during their English classes. Electronic resources have been increased to accommodate the current needs of students.
Title 1	 Dr. Poll reviewed the Title I funding for the current school year. The expected budget was \$319,000 but that could change. The majority of the budget goes to staffing. Funding pays for 3.5 teachers. Grant funding is used to hire 3 Student Success Coordinators (5.9 hours a day) that work with students and are available for substitute teaching if needed.
Other Items	• There was a motion to skip the January meeting as little school time would occur over the winter holiday. The Council approved the motion with a 10-0 vote.
