1. Welcome: In attendance are: Julie Lundell, Maree Pope, Jen Merrill, Eric Peterson, Amanda Mitchell, and Lori James
2. Review of Minutes : Eric approved them and Maree seconded them
3. School Improvement Plan: --The council reviewed school data from the SRI (reading inventory) and where we are at the Beginning of the Year Dibels, along with comparison data from previous years without the soft closure. There are greater differences with our youngest learners, who have had less time in school and instruction. --We are continuing the focus on implementation of Social Emotional learning as a school improvement goal, and discipline referrals are showing a large decrease as a result of our school wide SEL skill instruction, along with high expectations, and even the distancing due to CoVid...especially with less students out at recesses together and the hybrid plan that the year began on.
4. School Business: --We reviewed our school wide behavior plan. --We are considering moving our fifth and sixth grades onto the Summit Learning platform. The highlights of this program were shared by Mrs. Lundell, with school focus being on the personalized learning opportunities, the student accountability, and the Habits of Success, which roll right into the Social Emotional Learning curriculum that students are utilizing throughout the school and district right now. Clinton is currently working on the application process and will make a final decision by January. 5th and 6th grade

teachers are visiting other schools with the program in place in order help make this determination.

--We do not have any cases of CoVid exposure within the school right now. There is a little discrepancy with the county dashboard, but we've not had to send out any letters at this point.

5. Community Business: Mrs. Merrill asked about the fence that went up on the west and the inaccessibility without walking all the way around the school to get to the bike racks. The purpose for the fence was as a safety precaution to take care of some of our youngest, most challenged students who may be a flight risk out the West doors and out onto 1800 N. Mrs. Lundell will re-evaluate.

We will not be meeting together again as a council until January, when we will be taking a closer look at our data and the school improvement plan for the next year.
