Requirements for admittance: Application which includes short answer and parent signature; teacher recommendation; interview; grades, behavior and attendance

Focus: Fundamental of college readiness, college and career exploration, ACT prep, student/parent financial literacy, financial aid assistance, student leadership, service learning projects, potential stipend for excellent academics and attendance

Requirements for admittance: Student application and parent application; tax and income information; two nomination forms; interview

Summer opportunity for grades 9—11: Classes for free and college credit. Transportation and food provided. Students can earn elective credits and get opportunities to visit several colleges and participate in a college tour at the end of the summer program. Students will be involved in various cultural events. The purpose of the summer program is to help students be academically prepared for the next grade level as well as explore their post-secondary options.
