Over the last several months, our community has faced, and currently still faces, countless challenges. With so much strain placed onto our families, the Church Street community wants to ensure the safety and wellbeing for all of our students. As a result, the Student Support Staff Team at Church Street School is reaching out to students and families to offer these lists of community resources. One outlines both social service and mental health providers. The second list highlights food pantries and soup kitchens for anyone in short supply of food.

Furthermore, the role of the Student Support Staff Team (SSS-T) centers around supporting families in any way we can and making sure their basic needs are met. Examples of basic needs, but not limited to, include access to food, shelter, wifi/ internet and clothes. The team consists of two School Social Workers, School Psychologist, Principal, Family Engagement Specialist, and School Climate Advisor. **All collected information by the team is confidential.**

Lastly, contact information of some of the Student Support Staff Team will be provided as well in case families have additional thoughts, questions or require more guidance on how to navigate the resources provided on these lists.

On Friday's, 3 days' worth of meals will be given to families picking up.

For 7-days' worth of Meal Pick-ups:

High School will be serving 7 days' worth of meals on Monday of each week (or the first open school day of the week). **Time: 1:30pm-2:30pm.**

Middle School will be serving 7 days' worth of meals on Monday of each week (or the first open school day of the week). **Time: 1:30pm-2:30pm.**

ALL 8 Elementary Schools will be serving 7 days' worth of meals on Monday of each week (or the first open school day of the week). **Time: 2pm-3pm.**

Alice Peck Learning Center will be serving 7 days' worth of meals on Monday of each week (or the first open school day of the week). **Time: 1:30pm-2:30pm.**

*Parents can pick up meals at the most convenient location nearest to them. **Please do not go to different sites to pick-up additional meals for the same group of children.** These meals will remain free until 12-31-20 or until the USDA allows it.
