Shady Side Academy is a nationally respected private school in Pittsburgh for boys and girls in grades pre-kindergarten through 12, with an optional boarding experience in high school. SHADY SIDE ATHLETICS


Shady Side understands the value of athletics extends far beyond the playing field. We view athletics as an integral part of the educational experience for all students, because it teaches students how to persevere, how to work together, how to overcome adversity, how to win and lose with grace, how to make healthy choices – lessons that students can apply in every aspect of their lives.

Senior and Middle School students are required to participate in athletics as part of the curriculum. The Senior School (grades 9-12) fields 29 highly competitive varsity/prep teams in 15 sports. Junior varsity and Middle School (grades 6-8) teams emphasize skill development and participation.

Shady Side Academy boasts a rich championship history in athletics. After many years in the Interstate Prep School League (IPSL), SSA rejoined the Western Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic League (WPIAL) in 1993 – a league it helped to found in 1906. The Academy has won 63 WPIAL, 15 PIAA (Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association), and four WIHLMA (Women's Interscholastic Hockey League of the Mid-Atlantic) championships since 1993. Each year, a number of SSA graduates go on to play NCAA athletics in college.

Shady Side students benefit from some of the region's finest on-campus athletic facilities, including a turf stadium with lights, hockey rink, swimming pool, gymnasiums, multiple grass fields, and tennis and squash courts.



THE POSITION: DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Shady Side Academy is a diverse, transformative learning community that challenges students to think expansively, act ethically, lead responsibly and seeks an innovative, inspiring school leader to serve as its next Director of Athletics, effective July 1, 2021.

The next Director of Athletics will embody the Academy's Guiding Principles of Honesty, Respect, Responsibility, Kindness, and Safety. The Director of Athletics will also be of high character, approachable, collaborative, and dedicated to excellence and integrity in all s/he does.

The Director of Athletics will embrace and advance equity, inclusion, and a culture of mentorship and professional learning. In its search for the next Director of Athletics, the Academy is eager to consider a highly diverse candidate pool.

Like all great school leaders, the Director of Athletics at Shady Side will combine high-energy with a steady, encouraging presence on campus. This person must be one "for all seasons" and always work to connect meaningfully with others.

The Director of Athletics will provide executive leadership for the comprehensive athletic program at SSA, overseeing both the strategic development and day-to-day operations of these programs across the Academy.

Additionally, the Director will earn the trust of school heads, enrollment team, alumni & development office, and marketing and communications personnel through regular collaboration and dialogue. Program evaluation and assessment are also crucial to success in the role.

Reporting directly to the President, the Director of Athletics will sit on Shady Side's Executive Leadership Team and help to nurture and sustain the school's culture, as well as to execute the Academy's strategic vision for the future.

In concert with such school-wide visioning, the Director of Athletics sets the direction for the Athletic Department while also overseeing a team that includes two Assistant Athletic Directors, a Middle School Athletic Coordinator, two full-time Athletic Trainers, an Equipment Manager, and an Administrative Assistant. The Director of Athletics also oversees all Senior School (grade 9-12) athletic coaches.

The Director of Athletics will become part of a thriving Athletic Department and have an excellent foundation on which to build. Overall, the challenge and opportunity in the Athletic Department is to leverage its current strengths, while also inspiring a relentless desire to improve each and every facet of student's experience in athletics.

Shady Side benefits from the clear and well-established prioritization of the athletic experience at SSA, a talented and dedicated coaching and instructional staff, expansive facilities, a talented and engaging student body, committed parents, a supportive alumni base, a balanced sense of tradition of innovation, and the department's integration with a historic and well-resourced PK-12 institution.



Among the many opportunities and challenges, this new leader will need to:

- Quickly generate community trust and confidence in succeeding a long-tenured and highly successful predecessor
- Assess the long-term sustainability of each of our current athletic offerings and take appropriate action steps in response to findings
- Collaborate with the Academy's enrollment, alumni & development, and communications & marketing
 personnel to ensure the athletic program supports Shady Side's mission and contributes to the broader
 strategic vision for the school
- Work with SSA's Business Office to support an annual budgeting process that is transparent, collaborative, and aligned with schoolwide priorities
- Review SSA's compensation model for coaches and institute necessary improvements in collaboration with the Chief Finance and Operations Officer
- Help ensure optimal use of the current athletic facilities while advising the administration about necessary maintenance and improvements
- Embrace the school's new mascot and help lead associated marketing and branding efforts, including potential partnerships with sportswear manufacturers
- Work with school heads to recruit, retain, and develop a diverse and talented coaching staff composed of both teacher-coaches and outside community coaches
- Partner effectively with the WPIAL, PIAA, WIHLMA, MPHL (Midwest Prep Hockey League) and their member schools while also advocating to these leagues on behalf of the unique interests of the SSA and, in the case of the WPIAL and PIAA, other independent schools
- Commit fully to the school's ongoing efforts to support matters of diversity, equity and inclusion, as well as student health and wellness

OTHER RESPONSIBILITIES

- As appropriate, teaches a class, serves as an advisor, and/or coaches a sport
- Additional duties as assigned by the President
- Extends beyond the job description to support the mission and strategic goals of the Academy

REQUIREMENTS

- Minimum of at least five years of administrative or executive leadership experience
- Bachelor's degree required; master's degree preferred
