- **Comments from the Principal:** Parent teacher conferences were a success. COVID 19 form letters continue to be sent out as cases are confirmed. Lincoln has had very few cases. Four active cases have been the most at a given time. There have not been any school spread cases, only community. Lincoln has done a great job at following the CDC guidelines. Teachers, students, and staff have been amazing at stopping and preventing the spread.

Construction update: Great progress is being made in the remodeling of our parking lots and drop off/pick up areas. Blacktop has been laid in the SW corner

behind the school. Big toy is up and working, as well as other play areas. Eight portables will be brought in to be placed there. It will be a two-day process to move the internal items from the current portable to the new eight portables. Drop off and pick up area on the west side of the school is almost ready to go. Lines need to be painted and RMP needs to move a power pole, in order for the lanes to be opened.

The four day in person class schedule started September 28th, 2020. This will continue for the foreseeable future.

School suspension was significantly down this year compared to last year at this time. This is possibly due to the hybrid schedule that took place the first few weeks for the elementary schools. Smaller classes mean less behavior problems. Kids thrive in smaller classrooms.

Every parent is encouraged to reach out to their School Board Representative and let their voice and needs be heard. Especially now during the pandemic and changing schedules.
