Updates for families with students in grades 6th through 12th:

- As a reminder, Parent/Teacher conferences for students in grades 6th through 12th will be held on Monday, Nov. 2 from 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. You should have received an email last week with further details about how to participate and how each conference will be structured. If you are unable to attend on Nov. 2, please reach out to your student's teacher(s) via email to make arrangements to speak with them during their office hours. - Over the last two weeks, our Board of Education made the decision to begin phasing elementary students back into in-person learning throughout the month of November and to bring our junior high, middle, and high school students back in-person on Jan. 4. I want to reiterate that even when students begin returning to their classrooms, Tulsa Virtual Academy students will remain in the Tulsa Virtual Academy for the remainder of this semester, and even for the rest of the school year if you choose.
- If you would prefer that your student return to in-person learning after the second quarter, there will be an opportunity to submit a transfer application to return to your home school before the second semester begins in late-January. You will receive more information about that transfer window over the next couple of months. Students who wish to stay in Tulsa Virtual Academy for the second semester of the school year will not need to re-enroll.
- Intercession is coming up! There will be no classes during the week of intercession, from Monday,
 Nov. 2 through Friday, Nov. 6. Teachers will be unavailable for assistance during this time. Students
 are welcome to continue working in their courses in Edmentum during this week. Even a couple
 hours spent in Edmentum during the entire week could be beneficial in helping students who are offpace get on-pace. This is not mandatory.
- The PSAT will be available at no cost to our 10th grade students at their home school on Thursday,
 Oct. 29. To get more information and to register your 10th grade student to take the PSAT, please
 contact their home school.
- Have you had a chance to explore all of the amazing resources available through the Tulsa Library?
 They have an awesome, free program called <u>Homework HelpNow!</u> There are several resources available through Homework HelpNow, including live tutoring help for students of all grade levels.
