BEFORE YOUR CHILD LEAVES FOR SCHOOL:

- □ Complete the Student Health Screening and answer "NO" to all guestions
- Keep your child home if the answer to any of the Student Health Screening questions is "YES."



- ☐ Face mask that covers nose and mouth
- □ Chromebook and Chromebook charger
- □ School supplies (pens, pencils, notebooks, etc.)
- □ Clever badge*
- □ Headphones*
- Reusable water bottle*
- Personal hand sanitizer*

PARENT AND GUARDIAN CHECKLIST

- □ **Plan for distance learning days on Wednesdays.** Students will learn in-person on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays. Wednesdays will be distance learning days for all students.
- □ **Get charged up.** Make sure your child brings their Chromebook and Chromebook charger to school. Charge devices the night before so your student is ready to learn. Students can also bring their own headphones if they have them. *Please note that students in pre-kindergarten and kindergarten will not need to bring technology to school.*
- □ **Pack a backpack.** While pre-kindergarten and kindergarten students can still use classroom cubbies, older students cannot use hallway lockers.
- □ **Stay in touch.** Make sure your child's school has an updated email and cell phone number for you.
- □ **Get on the bus.** Routes and schedules are online at TulsaSchools.org/bus.
- **Be there on time.** School bell-times are online at TulsaSchools.org/belltimes.
- **Know what to wear.** We are relaxing student uniform requirements; learn more at <u>TulsaSchools.org/uniforms</u>. Our district dress code remains in effect and is available at TulsaSchools.org/tpsdresscode.



STUDENT MASK REQUIREMENTS

- » Masks must cover the nose and mouth.
- » Masks must be worn any time or place where other people are present.
- » Masks may be removed at mealtimes, outdoors, and during mask breaks.
- » Masks should be two or more layers.
- » Bandanas, handkerchiefs, fleece balaclavas, neck gaiters (without filters), or any other piece of cloth tied with an opening at the bottom are not allowed.

Parents will be notified for the first two incidents of students not following mask requirements; a third incident results in students returning to distance.

ACCEPTABLE MASKS

- » Homemade masks
- » Surgical/procedural masks (tie or ear loop)
- » Dust masks
- » N95 masks without vents
