Basketball

Plans for basketball are still in development, and the Sports Committee is closely following all the latest developments in the broader Rhode Island sports community. CAL has recently announced that the 2020-2021 season will be delayed until at least January 2021. As many of you know, a significant amount of planning goes into each basketball season, and our planning is well underway. To that end, we are currently opening basketball registrations in Teamsnap to determine player interest and to allow us to begin forming teams.

Grades K – 3 participate in Biddyball, which is a school sponsored instructional basketball program. Similar to instructional soccer sessions run for one hour on Saturday mornings and focus on helping our youngest athletes develop basic basketball skills. - Registration is to determine interest only, and there is currently no fee required. Fees are expected to be approximately \$30 for Biddyball and \$50 \$75, plus the cost of uniforms for those who will need them, for CAL Basketball, but will be subject to change as we get more info.
- Please register 3rd graders for Biddyball for the time being. Depending on the numbers, some 3rd grades may have the opportunity to play on the CAL Instructional team. 3rd graders ALWAYS have the option to play Biddyball if they are more comfortable.
- Please register by November 15th. We need an accurate count of players by that time in order to properly form team.
