Elementary Enrichment Classes

Spanish

K-5 Spanish at SRVCA offers elementary students the opportunity to creatively explore the Spanish language. Through the use of worksheets, games, and songs, students become familiar with various topics in Spanish utilizing immersion as the children progress.

Music

Spanish

6th grade students begin to conjugate verbs and master vocabulary and spelling. 7th and 8th grade Spanish focuses on learning the skills accomplished in a high school Spanish I class including: Spanish grammar, written and oral presentations, and discussions about the culture of Spanish speaking people. Upon graduation from middle school, students are generally able to move directly into Spanish II and occasionally Spanish III.
