Reviewed of minutes from previous meeting

Emergency Plan for School:

We had a guest Mr. Paul Schulte, Executive Director of Auxiliary Services, to discuss how schools prepare for different types of emergencies. Mr. Schulte explained that all employees in the district get trained in all types of emergencies. He also said all employees are required to wear their ID badge to be identified and to get access to different areas in the building. Mr. Schulte said that statistics show that a school is the safest place for children.

Active Shooter:

If able, the teacher and students may leave the school and/or find a safe place to hide, be quiet, or fight.

Bomb Threat:

Work with local authorities to evaluate how dangerous the situation is and evacuate the school.

Intruder:

The school has cameras and a doorbell to make sure this does not happen. Sometimes an intruder can be a non-custodial parent or an upset parent. If anyone notices someone wandering in the school, please remind them to check-in in the office.

Earthquake:

In case of an earthquake, students need to drop, cover, and hold on. It is recommended that students or staff take cover under a desk or a chair and hold on to it. If a student or adult is outside, stay outside. If a student or adult is inside the building, stay inside.

A Lockout:

A lockout is one of the most common emergencies. This type of emergency occurs when something happens in the neighborhood. All students are kept inside of the school, and instruction continues as usual.

A Lockdown:

During this type of emergency, everyone is inside, all doors are locked, lights off, and everyone is silent.
