- Continue to see goals on end level assessments increase for students
- Support students with social and emotional needs by providing safest and healthiest inclusive environment.

SMART goals-

- By first quarter ensure that every student has all the necessary tools (laptops, hotspots etc.) -Engagement with our families have made this successful
- 50% of ELL students close to grade level or growth score-This goal has been recently achieved. (52.5% ELL students reached adequate progress and 10% proficiency which passed the district and state average)
 - This goal was met because of the positive interactions with families and changing experiences with families to a positive one.

HB 58-Matt Stroshine

- Presented slides regarding HB 58 requirements which are a subsection of PBIS and is a prevention program to help students to stay away from using E-cigarettes/cigarettes, drugs and controlled substances
- Matt (school counselor) is assigned as the Positive Behavior Specialist and contact for Escalante
- "Clearing the Vapor" is the program added in this year to the HB58 program requirements
- If student is found with drugs, controlled substances and/or cigarettes, principal must confiscate from student and place in the disposal container located in the nurse station at school
- Principal can use discretion when it comes to reporting to school SRO officer or handling the situation at school only level
