Motion to approve the minutes with correction of Meeting Time to 6:00, made, seconded and approved.

Chairperson's report. SCC timeline was brought up and Merrie wanted information about SCC responsibilities. Andy was also wanting the same. This information is posted on the school web page under the community tab. She also asked about having a Vice Chairperson. Joseph was nominated and elected to act as Vice Chair in Merrie's absence.

Principal's report. Marian showed us the Filtering report – this will go out to parents and is also posted in the foyer and on the website. The question was asked about students bringing electronic devices to school. We do not recommend it. If students do bring a phone, they may keep it on them, but it should be off. To avoid interruptions in the classrooms, there is a phone available in the office and students can get help to remember their phone numbers and use the phone.

There are also a number of good resources regarding SCC, its duties and responsibilities on the School Land Trust web site, accessible through our school web page.

Marian is asking for information and help from ResponseAbility web page about their training modules.

We are implementing use of the Golden Rule Project to support our 8 Keys of Success and Love&Logic. Students will be making postcards to demonstrate application of the Golden Rule. These will be distributed to several organizations to be given to their residents.

Shared Governance Training – Marian & Joseph: We went through the Power Point presentation about the principles and implementation of Shared Governance and the roles of Faculty, Administration, SIC and SCC

in the decision making process for Hawthorne. Mat asked about the number of votes needed for approving a decision in SCC. We determined that a simple majority was necessary to pass an item, but that there always had to be one more Community voter than faculty voter so that the rights of the community would be upheld.

C&A – Kristie: Everything seems to be moving along, and everyone is getting along.

ELP – Lizzie: Fundraising to support Spanish program was discussed in the ELP Steering Committee and the idea to use the Golden Rule Project postcards to ask for donations from ELP families was put forward. They brought this issue to us and approval was put to a vote – it passed 6-3.

Neighborhood – Ashley: we are still waiting to see the traffic signs and other traffic . Ashley suggested we might want to create a smaller committee to continue to work on this issue.

PTA – Ashley: Tomorrow night is the Chipotle fundraiser - 30% to the PTA. Items can be placed online but must be paid for in store (You must have a flyer with you). The Hawk walk generated \$10,000 and PTA has increased their funding for fieldtrips by \$5 per student. Vision screening is tomorrow – Selective grades will be tested. Reflections contest rules are posted in the foyer and submissions are due Oct. 24th. The School Halloween parade will be at 8:30 am on Thursday the 31st. RIF is Nov 26th.

Snacks provided for Faculty and staff during SEP conferences was appreciated. PTA will collect unwanted Halloween candy in the week after Halloween to donate to the Food Bank,

Faculty – Beth: We would like to skip red ribbon week this year, and to look at doing it next year in our calendaring meeting? We asked if it could be tied into a Safety Fair? Our day of service was a great success. Joseph wanted to let the PTA know that their support of the Book Fair was essential to the success of the bookfair – raising \$1000 for the library.
