St. Martinville Primary Parental Involvement Policy

Mission Statement: At St. Martinville Primary School, students are empowered and encouraged to build trusting relationships that foster academic growth and leadership.

Vision Statement: By teaching to and from the mind, heart, body, and spirit, St. Martinville Primary is a school where every student is empowered and encouraged to develop those gifts through relationships that demonstrate/develop growth and leadership.

Statement of Purpose: The St. Martin Parish School Board recognizes that parental involvement is the key to academic achievement. The term parent refers to any caregiver who assumes responsibility for nurturing and caring for children, including parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, foster parents, stepparents, etc. Studies demonstrate that when parents are involved in their children's education, the attitudes, behaviors, and achievement of students are positively enhanced.

Parents and families provide the primary educational environment for children; consequently, parents are vital and necessary partners with the educational communities, throughout their children's school career. Although parents come to the schools with diverse cultural backgrounds, primary languages, and needs, universally all parents want what is best for their children. Parental involvement must be a focus in the classroom if schools are to be able to achieve high academic standards and create productive citizens. <u>Standard Two: Parenting Skills</u> St. Martinville Primary is committed to enriching parenting skills, aiding parents in providing homes that support childhood education and development, and furthering the education of our staff in working effectively with the diversity represented by our SMP families. To meet the commitment, the following actions will be taken by St. Martinville Primary:

- *Providing a Title 1 Meeting to explain Title 1 policies, services and compacts
- *Sending home test taking tips/strategies for grades 3-5
- *Hosting a Math (STEM Night) and ELA Night
- *Sponsoring an Annual Meet and Greet Activity

<u>Standard Three: Student Learning and Learning at Home:</u> St. Martinville Primary is committed to continually improving the learning opportunities for students both on campus and at home. Learning at home includes family interaction that supports school based learning and provides encouragement and guidance for good student education. To meet this committee, the following actions will be taken by St. Martinville Primary:

- *Making parents aware of Accelerated Reader program and STEM program

<u>Standard Four: Volunteering:</u> St. Martinville Primary faculty and staff recognize the large variety of opportunities for parents and the community to volunteer in the support of student learning and success. The benefits of a cohesive community and school family are strongly appreciated and encouraged.
