You will study a range of topics including

UK Government and Parliament – this looks at how our UK system works, including the role of the PM and the constitution

UK Political parties and voting systems – in this topic we study how political parties work and the methods by which we elect our leaders

Political philosophy and ideologies – this is often the most intriguing aspect. We study the philosophical ideas behind ideologies such as socialism, conservatism and nationalism

US Government and Politics – this is similar to the UK section, however based on a comparison of how the USA conducts its systems

Politics is a fascinating A level which embraces aspects of History, Economics, social study and current affairs.

It is ever changing and frequently we will study things which are in the news such as elections and controversies.
