

College and Career Readiness in the Elementary years

-Kids decide on college between 9-13, so it is important to get them thinking about it early

-Parkview is working to support College and Career Readiness through:

- AVID strategies
- College and Career Readiness Lessons
- An environment that promotes college
- College Night
- College visits

-Parents can support college by:

- Talking about college
- Using language that makes college an expectation, "when you go to college" vs. "if you go to college"
- Make visits to college campuses
- Set up a college savings account
- Encourage students to read

-Addressing Barriers

- Money: Students can apply for scholarships, grants, work study, and LOANS. Fill out the Federal Application for Student Aid.
- Students who are undocumented: HB 144 guarantees in-state tuition for any student who graduated from a Utah high school and who qualifies for residency, regardless of citizenship status
- Culture: We recognize that colleges right now are heavily weighted in Western culture, however it does not have to stay that way. The key to making colleges be more representative of our communities is to get diverse students educated.

Safe School Routes: Principal is working on updating school routes. Item tabled until next meeting.
