1. Welcome/Introductions-Vice-Chair, Shantell Rohlfing
2. Minutes from October 25, 2018 meeting
3. Turkey Distribution-November 19, 2018-Flyer to go home with students.
4. Update on Focus Areas for 90 Day Plan-August to December 2018
 - Student Engagement/High Expectations-We are currently three percentage points away from achieving our goal of fifty percent of more student talk by December 6, 2018. On November 6th and November 8th, UEPC collected data on each classroom. In addition to the 47% of increased student talk occurring school wide, 67% of students are speaking in complete sentences and using extended student talk in their conversations.
 - Creating a Safe and Welcoming Environment for students-We had district personnel do a PD for our faculty on Restorative Practices. This was a continuation of the training teachers received in August before the start of the school year. In the training teachers learned more about the three restorative practice tiers and the types of student behaviors that occur in each tier.

Teachers also learned more about the differences between the traditional approach to address behavior issues and the restorative way of addressing behavior issues. The traditional way of dealing with discipline is punitive or punishment while the restorative way is to have students be accountable for their behavior and make the situation right when a wrong was done. Teachers are continuing to do Community Circles in the classrooms weekly. Teachers received resources they can use in the classroom that promote restorative practices when addressing discipline issues that come up.

5. Safety Survey- The next Safety Survey is scheduled on January 14, 2018.

- We had an assembly titled “No Greater Heroes” on Tuesday, November 13 that was positively received by students and staff. The focus was on how students can be their best on hero by having the courage to say no to drugs, alcohol and tobacco and to make good choices about the things they put in their bodies.
- On November 15, we will have an anti-bullying assembly sponsored by author of children’s books, Jason Wright. His message is a positive one that will focus on relationships and respect. This assembly was paid for from a grant from an anonymous donor whom we very much appreciate for their kindness and generosity. These assemblies will help us support our students in making good choices and making our school safer and inviting for everyone which is tied into our second goal.

- The walk to our primary location for safety in case of school evacuation went well. The students enjoyed the parade, several parents and extended family members came to watch the parade.
