Y7 – Y13 Cheshire and Warrington Career and Education Expo



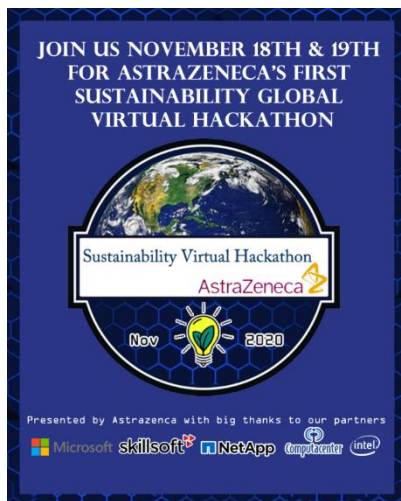
