

Strong Curriculum

Kindergarten is the beginning of a child's iourney into elementary school. We have embedded S.T.E.M. (Science. Technology, Engineering, and Math) into our kindergarten curriculum to provide opportunities for problemsolving and critical thinking. We pair excellent teaching with the right technology. Creativity is fostered through student participation in Music, Art. Physical Education, and Media classes.

Open Communication

Parents and quardians are partners with teachers in our schools. We offer many opportunities for family involvement and tools for keeping parents/guardians well informed about their child's progress.

Safe & Secure Schools

Physical, mental, and emotional safety of students is our priority. We have substantial security measures in place to ensure the safety of vour child including an ID scan for visitors, secure signout for students when leaving school, and video monitoring of our buildings and buses. Our staff is committed to providing a safe, welcoming. inclusive, and equitable learning environment for all students.

Robust Supports

Fach school has a team of teachers who have additional training in the areas of special education, speech/language, English language learners, aifted services, adaptive physical education, social work, counseling, and school psychology.





Health and Safety

The health and safety of our students is always a priority, never more than this year due to COVID-19. We are hopeful that conditions will improve before your child starts kindergarten, but know that we maintain a close relationship with local and state health agencies to ensure we are fully aligned with all current health and safety recommendations in this ever-evolving situation.

Some of the steps taken this year include:

- All staff and students wearing face coverings
- Enhanced building HVAC systems to improve ventilation/airflow
- Signage to promote social distancing
- Frequent hand washing opportunities
- Installation of hand sanitizer dispensers
- Protective barriers in offices and common spaces
- Isolation rooms for sick children.
- Regular cleaning of high touch areas
- Increased cleaning of buses and decreased bus capacity

Your Neighborhood School

Each neighborhood boundary school offers an outstanding kindergarten program that has been carefully designed for vound learners.

La Academia Spanish Immersion School

La Academia is a two-way, dual language Spanish Immersion school; this immersion model is unique to the west metro. A typical day looks very similar to other kindergarten classes, but the curriculum is taught in Spanish.

Kinder Academy Program for Young Learners

Parents and guardians frequently ask, "Is my child ready for kindergarten?" If your child meets the state age requirement - five years old on or before September 1 of the kindergarten year - the answer is "yes." Kinder Academy is designed for young five-year-olds, such as those with summer birthdays.

Neighborhood School

Our kindergarten program develops children academically, socially, and emotionally. Students are introduced to reading skills, writing and, problem-solving and are provided personalized instruction and support as they progress. We have integrated S.T.E.M. (Science. Technology, Engineering, and Math) concepts into our rich curriculum, and technology is used in the classroom to enhance learning experiences for students. Students also attend specialist classes such as Physical Education, Music, Media, and Art.

Spanish Immersion School La Academia



In this two-way immersion program, students have the opportunity to be both first-language models and second-language learners with native English and Spanish speakers beginning in kindergarten.

A typical day in La Academia looks very similar to a traditional classroom. Students work toward the same academic standards. attend specialist classes, and go to lunch and recess. Teachers in dual language immersion may be especially animated as they use unique methods and strategies to help students learn a new language: this includes many gestures, pantomimes, songs, props, and other instructional tools. Transportation is provided to La Academia students that live within our district.

La Academia families must complete a parent contract as part of the enrollment process. Registration must be completed by January 15, 2021, at 4:00 p.m. to be included in the placement lottery. Registrations received after January 15th will be placed on a waitlist.

Kinder Academy: **Program for Young Students**

Kinder Academy is a program for young five-year-olds, such as those with summer birthdays. The program follows Eastern Carver County Schools' kindergarten curriculum. Students who are ready to move on to first grade after one year will do so. Students who would benefit from an additional year will stay in the program. The teacher will modify the curriculum for the older children's developmental level. The older kindergarten students become leaders in the class and role models to incoming five-year-olds. This program is housed at La Academia and is not an early entrance option. Transportation is provided to Kinder Academy students that live in our district.

Kinder Academy families must complete a parent contract as part of the enrollment process.

Club Care **Before & After School Child Care**



Club Care is an optional, fee-based, before- and after-school child care program for students kindergarten through 5th grade. The program is in high demand due to its excellent quality, convenience, and competitive fees. Enrollment in Club Care is not guaranteed, and each school has a limited enrollment capacity. Students must be registered in kindergarten prior to registering for Club Care (eccs.mn/clubcare).

- A child-centered, developmentally appropriate learning environment
- Opportunities for academic skills reinforcement
- · Recreation and enrichment activities that include art, science, computer lab, gvm and outdoor play
- Before-and after-school hours conveniently located in your child's school

- Opportunities for growth and the development of social skills
- School release days and summer program options
- Daily morning and afternoon snack

*What I Need (WIN) time is set aside during the day for tailored instruction for student's individual needs. This may mean working oneon-one with teachers or working in small groups. We meet students where they are at in their learning.







What You Need to Know



Required Early Childhood Screening

The State of Minnesota requires that students entering kindergarten complete an Early Childhood Screening prior to the start of school. The screening is free to Eastern Carver County Schools residents.

If your child has not yet been screened, please schedule an appointment as soon as possible online at eccs.mn/screening or call (952)556-6407.

If your child was screened in another school district, please provide a copy of the screening record to the Welcome Center (welcomecenter@district112.org).

Required Immunizations & Health Services

Your kindergartener must be up-to-date on all immunizations before starting school. Kindergarten boosters are required after the age of 4. The immunization form or a copy of your child's immunization record, even if partially complete, should be submitted with your registration. Please schedule an appointment with your child's pediatrician for a well-child check and immunizations before the start of kindergarten. Schedule the appointment early as August is a very busy time for clinics with many requests for well-child checks before school begins. Minnesota Immunization Law allows for the exemption of these vaccines for medical or conscientious beliefs with notarization.

All elementary schools are staffed with a registered nurse all day. Our health services staff will work with you to accommodate your child's health needs. Please complete and return the health form (eccs.mn/healthform) with the registration forms. This information helps us to prepare for all health needs on the first day of school.

Campus Parent Portal

Campus Portal will provide you access to information about attendance, busing, class schedule, grades, news, and alerts from your child's school. An activation code for your account will be emailed to you shortly after the kindergarten registration is fully processed.



Bus Transportation

Transportation is provided to Eastern Carver County Schools free of charge to those who live in the district boundaries unless you live close enough to your school to be in the no-bussing zone. Neighborhood bus stops are assigned with student safety as a priority. When our students arrive at school, we greet them as they get off the bus, and then at the end of the day, we escort them back to the bus.

Information about the bus stops and schedule will be available in August via the Campus Parent Portal.

If your child will need an alternative or additional bus stop other than your home address, please complete the request form found here eccs.mn/transportation. You do not need to complete a form if your child will be picked up and dropped off from your home address.

Connect & Assess

Kindergarten students and their parents/quardians will join their teacher before the first day of school for a Connect & Assess meeting. Teachers meet one-on-one with each learner to begin a positive school-home relationship and to gather some baseline information about each child in areas such as number and letter recognition. These are not tests of ability or intelligence. This personal interaction allows teachers to better meet each learner's needs as the school year begins and gives students time to gain familiarity with their teacher, classroom, and school building. More information about these meetings and scheduling will be available from your child's school in August.

Checklist to Enroll Now



Student Enrollment Due January 15 Enroll at eccs.mn/enroll or visit the Welcome Center (11 Peavey Road, Chaska) to complete the registration forms. Enrollment is
not complete without these items:
Birth Certificate: A photo copy of your child's birth certificate
Immunization Record: Complete the online form or provide a copy of your child's immunization record
Proof of Residency: A current utility bill, signed rental/lease agreement, or signed purchase agreement
Early Childhood Screening (due ASAP): If your child has been screened in another school district, please send a copy of the screening record. If your child has not been screened, schedule an appointment as soon as possible online at eccs.mn/screening or by calling (952)556-6407
Alternate Address Bus Request Please complete the Transportation Registration Form (eccs.mn/transportation) only if your child needs transportation to/from an address other than your home address such as daycare
Student Health Form Complete the health form (eccs.mn/healthform) and submit with your registration, this information is shared with school nurses to help us to prepare for and accommodate any health needs on the first day of school
