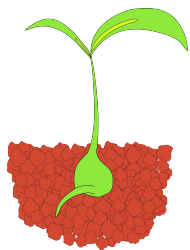

Next week we will begin our discussion on thankfulness! We will discuss the idea of being thankful and the traditions surrounding the Thanksgiving celebration.

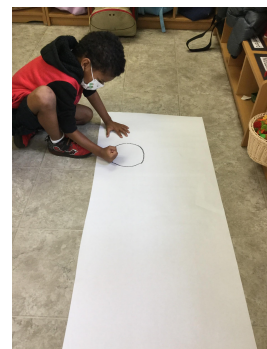
Supplies: crayons, construction paper, glue, scissors, etc.



It all started with a tiny seed. We began our harvest curriculum by asking the question of “where did the fruit/veggie come from?” The children answered, “They all came from a seed!” By looking at the end product (a bell pepper), the children had the ability to see the processes of how fruits and veggies become to be.



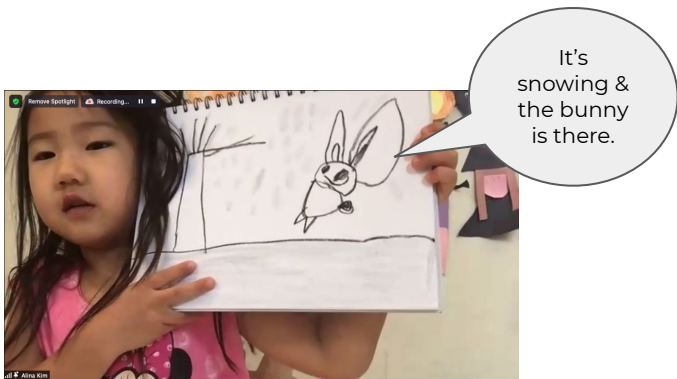
The children learned that we harvest crops and that crops are the fruits and veggies we eat. But in order to grow crops, we need something to protect them from animals who want to eat them when they aren't yet ready to be picked. We discussed scarecrows and explained how helpful they are to farmers who plant fields of crops!



The children created their very own carrot scarecrows out of carrot pieces. They had the opportunity to create and tell a story about their carrot scarecrow. Some went on wild adventures and others met different friends in the crop field.
