






Pupil Acceptable Use Agreement –EYFS – September 2020

I know that I must keep the rules when I use the internet, computers, iPads, tablets, cameras, beebots and interactive whiteboards. This is so everyone is safe, and so equipment does not get broken.

This is how we stay safe::


 <p>I will ask a teacher or suitable adult if I want to use the computers, iPads, tablets, ICW or cameras.</p>	 <p>I will only open and use activities that a teacher or suitable adult has told, or allowed me, to use.</p>
 <p>I will check if I can tap/click on things I haven't seen before. I will ask for help from a teacher or suitable adult if I am not sure what to do or if I think I have done something wrong.</p>	 <p>I will be kind and respectful to others when using computers, technology and apps.</p>



I will take care of the computer and other digital equipment.



I know I must never communicate with strangers online. I know I must not share my own information like my birthday or address.



I will tell a teacher or suitable adult if I see something that upsets or worries me on the screen. I will click on the 'report to teacher' button in Purple Mash if I see something that upsets or worries me on the screen.



I will follow the rules of Zip it, Block it, Flag it, to keep me safe online.

I know that if I break the rules there will be a consequence. I might not be allowed to use a computer.

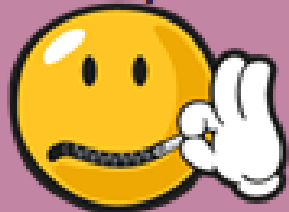
This EYFS Acceptable Use Policy is to make sure:

Take Care - Zip It



Do not give out your name, address, school or phone number.

Some people and things are not what they seem.

Never meet up with anyone you only know through the internet.

Technology



Use all technology including mobile phones, games consoles, iPads, tablets, computers respectfully and with an adult's permission.

Only use your own account.

Always log off or lock your device.

Truthful



Not all information on the internet is truthful. Check it is from a reliable website. Check it matches two other websites.

Ask an adult to check it is not a hoax or fake news

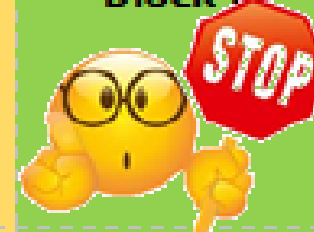
Take Time - Think



Take time to be kind. Think before posting messages or images that could be hurtful or embarrassing to you or others.

Be kind.

Trouble - Block It



Don't accept messages, images, texts from people you don't know. It can lead to trouble like viruses or lots of unwanted messages.

Tell - Flag It



Tell an adult immediately if anything makes you feel worried or uncomfortable.

Leave the site or put the screen in bank mode so no-one else sees or hears anything.
