OUR MISSION

Cardinal Newman is a Catholic, college preparatory high school. Our mission is to educate our students in the wholeness of mind, body, and spirit through the teachings of Jesus Christ as proclaimed by the Catholic Church. Our students learn to apply leadership skills and talents in service to others. We challenge each student to work to his or her highest potential in the lifelong pursuit of learning and excellence.





Cardinal Newman is located in the wine producing area of Sonoma County. Santa Rosa is fifty miles north of San Francisco and has a population of approximately 175,000. Our close-knit community draws from public, private, and Catholic schools throughout the North Bay and encompasses students of all faiths. Tuition assistance is available to families based on need. Our mission calls us at Cardinal Newman to create a diverse cultural environment that promotes learning and service in the community.

COURSE WORK

One semester of course work equals 5 credits, 10 credits equaling 1 year of course work. Taking seven courses each semester for four years and completing community service allows the student to complete 290 credits.

The 270 credits listed under Graduation Requirements are the minimum to graduate. Additional course work in Modern & Classical Languages, Mathematics and Science is recommended by the UC and California State University systems.

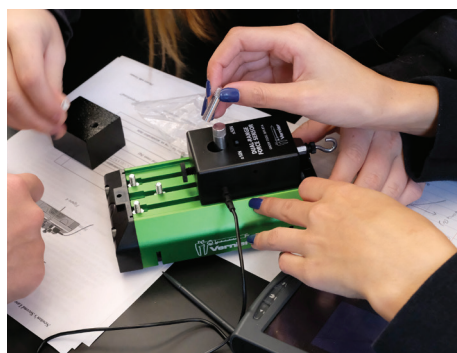
A NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED COMMUNITY BASED SERVICE PROGRAM

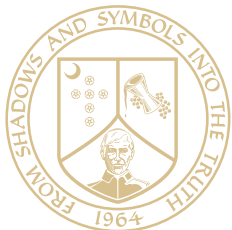
