SPECIAL PROGRAMS

- ▶ AP Capstone Diploma
 - Based on a two year program of AP Seminar and AP Research.
 - Generally offered in Junior (AP Seminar) and Senior (AP Research) years.
 - Focused on skills of research, analysis, evidence based arguments, collaboration, writing and presenting.
- ▶ Guatemalan Diploma
 - Issued by the Ministry of Education.
 - Students in the program receive both a Guatemalan and US diploma.
 - Students complete additional coursework, including a graduation seminar project that incorporates service.

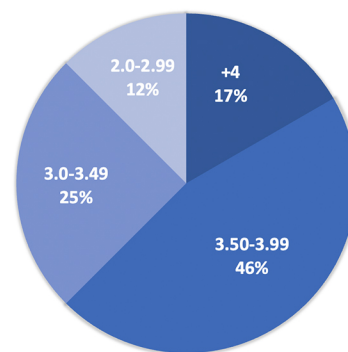

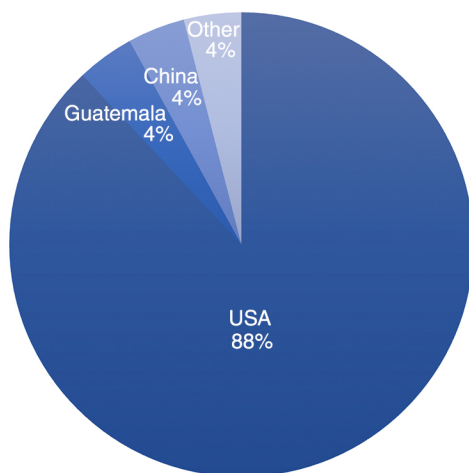
