Principal's Message

Thank you for the overwhelming support and messages following my appointment as Principal. It has been a pleasure to see the children return this term and come straight back into their learning environments showing their POW values.

Following the announcement from the government last weekend and the subsequent guidance this week, please may I ask all parents and carers to wear a **mask at all times** whilst on the school site, **maintain social distance** and remember to **only have one adult/carer** to drop off and collect to **minimise numbers and time present** on site. This is especially true of when an older sibling is collected as they can sometimes be accompanied by another student which can unwittingly increase numbers. All these measures are to minimise the impact on our community when there are positive cases. The more we adhere to these measures, the less chance a positive case will impact the school community, resulting in less bubbles needing to be sent home and reduced numbers of parents and carers needing to self isolate for 14 days.

Supporting the community

Lenny is one of our WSLPA pupils who is a wheelchair user and has little independent mobility. His family are fund raising £25,000 for Just4Children to enable him to have SDR surgery (Selective Dorsal Rhizotomy) at Nottingham children's hospital as he has been accepted there by the surgeon to go on the waiting list. This opportunity to have this surgery will give Lenny a chance to lead a more independent life with more mobility. He will be also pain free and will be able to do so much more.








Spooky Spectacular Reader Competition

- · Sir Francis Drake & sailing (exploring, hygiene, food, navigation, punishments, dangers, the Spanish, treasure and spoils).


This workshop will take place on **Friday 20th November 2020** in the school hall to support social distancing.

Guidance on School Attendance During Lockdown

The government has provided the following advice:

Guidance on the <u>new national restrictions</u> makes it clear the government is continuing to prioritise the long term future of children and young people therefore early years settings, schools, colleges and universities will remain open.

It is very important for children and young people to attend their education setting for their wellbeing and long-term development.

School attendance continues to be mandatory although the expectations have changed for children who have been identified as clinically extremely vulnerable.

Parent Consultations

As you will have seen, the bookings for parent consultations have begun through Parentmail. As these start soon, we wanted to outline some of the key points to help you better understand the format to this amended system:

- 1. Meetings will remain at ten minutes long as they have done in the past. Please be mindful of this when talking to your child's teacher as others will be awaiting their calls at the allotted time and it may cause a delay to all subsequent phone calls if this is not adhered to.
- 2. In the event that you are not able to pick up your call, a voicemail will be left by the teacher to specify the time that they will call you back. Please do not return the call yourself as this will cause disruption to the outgoing calls occurring on that day.
- 3. Teachers will be focusing primarily on discussing the learning in class during these meetings to ensure they can be timely for each parent or carer. If you wish to discuss anything further with the teacher, please allow them to arrange a separate phone call at a later date.
- 4. As the volume of outgoing calls will be very high during these weeks, it may mean that other communications with parents may be delayed as we will be using all phone lines for the purposes of the consultations. For example, if you have asked to speak to a teacher over the phone for a different reason, please be aware that they may not be able to do this straight away when a number of other teachers are completing the consultations.

Thank you for your understanding. We have no doubt that this amended format of the consultations during these unprecedented times will allow you to gain a useful insight into your child's learning.
