Apart from the Warrior Difference Annual Fund, highlighted below are two additional areas where your gifts can directly impact important initiatives for our students and teachers.

Tuition Assistance Goal - \$1M

Embracing the Value of Community - Tuition Assistance

Promoting a diverse socioeconomic and cultural community: Provides partial needs-based tuition assistance to more than 100 students, giving them the opportunity to be a part of the Liberty community.

Teacher Sustainability Goal - \$254,000

Enhancing the Faculty Compensation Model

Rewards teachers for advanced degrees and relevant certifications, and raises their salaries to compete with market standards. After generous donations to date, the 20-21 fiscal year goal is \$254,000 to continue moving toward the overall goal of \$1.6 million, leading Liberty into a competitive market that allows our community to keep and hire the best Christian professional educators.
