As a result, the District made the decision to move to remote learning to build up our student and staff ranks to full strength so that we can return to the gold standard of in-person learning after the Thanksgiving break.

The District also approved a plan that will return grades 6-12 to full in-person learning on January 4^{th,} 2021. We have developed remote virtual learning options for families who are seeking that option who want to keep their student connected with building teachers.
