MODELS OF INSTRUCTION

DISTANCE LEARNING


Learning that takes place remotely 100% of the time. Could be described as Remote Learning.

HYBRID LEARNING

Teaching and learning that includes a combination of in-person and virtual learning.

IN-PERSON LEARNING

Teaching and learning that occurs in-person at the physical school sites (100% of the time).



Each stage will gradually bring students to campus either in larger groups or for longer periods of time and provides flexibility to move between the stages as needed.

Hybrid Models of Instruction

Stage	Students physically present	On-campus instruction time
1	3 Cohorts (1/3 student body) 8-12 students per classroom	3 hours, 1 day per week per cohort
2	2 Cohorts (1/2 student body) 13-16 students per classroom	3 hours, 1 day per week per cohort
3	2 Cohorts (1/2 student body) 13-16 students per classroom	3 hours, <u>2 days per week per cohort</u>
4	2 Cohorts (1/2 student body) 13-16 students per classroom	Full day, 2 days per week per cohort
5	All students	Full day 2 days per week

Engage. Distancing & Equipment

Distancing

- 6 foot physical distancing is required throughout district facilities. Signage and markings are posted as reminders.
- Congregation is minimized through the use of teleconferencing, limiting room occupancy, designated one-way paths, and more.
- In-person gatherings of any size are discouraged, but may not exceed 10.

Equipment

- Personal protective equipment (PPE) is well stocked and readily available.
- Face coverings have been distributed to on-site staff.







Engage. Hygiene & Screening

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Hygiene

- Permanent handwashing signs have been installed over all sinks districtwide.
- Hand sanitizer is available in areas without sink and portable hand sanitizer stands and bottles are stocked.

Wellness Screening

- Wellness screenings are conducted prior to entering any facility, when feasible.
- The workflow immediately flags affirmative responses.




Engage. Testing & Tracing

Testing

- COVID-19 testing (for symptoms or close contacts) is recommended by health officials.
- Surveillance testing plans are ready should we be directed by public health to surveil staff.

Tracing

- Upon notification of a laboratory confirmed case of COVID-19, the district's compliance team goes into action and implements our containment, response, and tracing protocols.
- The team includes the designated public health liaison, human resources representative, registered nurse, and site administrator.

Empower. Disinfection





Frequently touched surfaces, common areas, and restrooms are **disinfected** throughout the day. **Cleaning** occurs after students and staff leave.

Empower. Ventilation

Actions for increasing ventilation in our classrooms

- HVAC systems are routinely maintained and are set to maximize indoor/outdoor air exchange.
- All filters are changed quarterly and have been upgraded to the highest efficiency possible.
- Aftermarket air purifiers are being researched currently that may add an additional layer of safety.
- Activities and meals are moved to outdoor spaces whenever feasible and weather permitting.








Actions for preparing instructional spaces

- Classroom furniture is set up to ensure 6 feet spacing between students at their tables and between students and teachers.
- Soft and porous materials, such as area rugs and seating, have been removed to reduce challenges with cleaning and disinfecting them and to allow proper spacing between desks.
- Furniture that is designed for in-class group activities that bring students closer than 6 feet have been reconfigured or removed.
