

Advanced Placement

Parkland offers 28 Advanced Placement (AP) courses as part of the high school curriculum. In 2023, 86% of the students who took 886 AP tests achieved a score of three or higher and 31% scored a five. These scores allow students to be eligible to receive college credit for the equivalent course at one of more than 2,900 colleges nationwide.



Parkland School District

The Parkland School District is located in the semimetropolitan region known as the Lehigh Valley. The Lehigh Valley region of eastern Pennsylvania is made up of Lehigh and Northampton counties and is home to the three cities of Allentown, Bethlehem and Easton, as well as numerous townships and boroughs. With approximately 687,000 residents, it is the third largest metropolitan region in the state. The Lehigh Valley maintains a strong commitment to educational excellence with 11 major institutions of higher learning, which graduate more than 10,000 students annually. The region's largest employers are ADP, Air Products, Amazon, B. Braun Medical, Crayola, Lehigh University, Mack Trucks, Olympus, and two hospital systems, Lehigh Valley Health Network and St. Luke's University Health Network.

The 72 square miles of the Parkland School District encompasses three townships with a total population of approximately 60,000. The District's wide socio-economic range results from it bordering the city of Allentown on the southeast and extending to farmland at the western and northern extremities.
