- District is 2,700 square miles

- Approximately 1500 degrees and certificates awarded each year





## Who Can Attend Community College

- Admission is open to anyone who is at least 18 years of age.
- High school students with permission from parents and high school can earn high school and college credit through <a href="Concurrent Enrollment">Concurrent Enrollment</a>

## Degree Options

#### **CERTIFICATES:**

- ☐ Short Term & Fast Track Training
- ☐ Usually less than 1 year

- ☐ Associate of Arts (AA) or Science (AS)
- ☐ 60 Units (usually 2 years)

#### ASSOCIATES DEGREE FOR TRANSFER

- ☐ 60 Units (usually 2 years)
- ☐ Complete General Education courses









# Transfer to a University of California

- \*29% of UC graduates started at a California community college.
- \*9 University of California schools

#### UC REQUIREMENTS FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS

- ☐ Complete 7 course pattern with a C or better
- ☐ Complete 60 semester units of transferable college credit with a GPA of at least 2.4





### UC Transfer Admission Guarantee

Six University of California (UC) campuses offer guaranteed admissions to students from all California Community Colleges. The writing of a TAG contract enables qualified students to be guaranteed admissions one year prior to transfer.

# Transfer to a California State University



- \*51% of CSU graduates started at a California community college
- \*23 California State University schools

#### CSU REQUIREMENTS FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS:

- ☐ Complete Golden 4 course pattern with a C or better
- ☐ Complete 60 semester units of transferable college credit with a GPA of at least 2.0

## Degree With A Guarantee

- **w** Students who meet the CSU's minimum eligibility requirements are guaranteed priority admission to a CSU campus.
- w Students can earn two degrees your associate's degree and your bachelor's degree with only 120 units if you transfer into a program at the CSU that's similar to the one in which you earned your associates at a California Community College.
- Talk with a counselor to develop a plan that will allow you to transfer to the CSU as part of the ADT program.

## Promise Program



First time college students who are California residents or have AB540 status can receive free tuition for up to 2 years.

# How do I apply for the Promise Program?

- \* Complete CCC Apply application
- \* File <u>FAFSA</u> or <u>Dream Act application</u> by March 2<sup>nd</sup>
- Complete online Orientation
- \* Enroll in and complete at least 12 units in Fall & Spring terms
- \* Awards made on a first-come first-served basis, so apply early!





# What's included in the Gavilan Promise Program?

- Free tuition
- \* \$300 textbook grant
- Priority registration Group 2
- \* Academic support services
- Progress monitoring
- Quality academic advising





### Financial Aid

- Financial aid is money made available by various sources to be used for education.
- \* Awards are calculated using the information on the FAFSA, including prior year income, assets, and family size.
- \* FAFSA opens on Oct. 1 and the deadline to submit is June 30 the following year.
  - Grants: Free money!

- Work-study: Part-time job
- Scholarships: Free money!
- Loans: Must be paid back





## **Scholarships**

- **ω** Open to all students
- w No limit on how many you can apply for
- There are need and merit-based scholarships for parttime and full-time students
- w Scholarships for continuing, transfer, new, and graduating high school students
- **w** Do not have to be paid back

### Concurrent Enrollment

- A Dual Enrollment program offers high school students an opportunity to complete college level course work and earn college credits while they are in high school.
- The Dual Enrollment model is designed for high school students who have a high school GPA of at least 2.0.
- \*Courses offered at partner high schools vary by semester and are coordinated between the college and high school.
  - See your high school academic counselor to determine eligibility

### Benefits of Concurrent Enrollment


- Most fees are waived.
- High school students experience college level work.
- Students earn college credit while still in high school
- Students advance academically

- Reduces fouryear university expense
- Students are competitive in the 4-year college and university admission process
- Courses are offered at the high school during or after regular school hours

## Tips for Online Success:

- \*Test computer equipment ahead of time

- \* Want to go mobile? You can download the Canvas mobile app for iPhone or Android. We recomment using a Bluetooth keyboard and maybe a mouse.
