Ensures academic advancement of students; has specific regulations that must be adhered to. Use budgetary trend data to inform decisions. In BVSD there is a carryover allocation.</p> <p>There was budget reduction this year but was managed with discretionary funds</p> <p>Internal School Accounts: generated by fees to purchase consumables, content specific resources to meet teachers teaching needs.</p> <p>District Survey goes out annually to provide feedback on budget priorities</p> <p>Open enrollment has implications for resource allocation</p> <p>Class size cap: 35; some cap at 30; average class size at MHS is 30/31</p> <p>Current health guardrails provide guidance based on # of students and square footage with 3-6' social distancing as acceptable. Approximately 11 students.</p>

Hopeful families will keep it as a reference.</p> <p>There is an important safety protocol that is dependent on families to support. If this is not done prior to school, kids cannot enter the building.</p> <p><b>Mr. Anderson</b> will confirm the contact tracing guidance on exposure time (10 min or 15 min)</p> <p><b>UPDATE:</b> From Ms. Faren, BVSD Director of Health and Nursing Services.</p> <p><i>This is the definition from CDPHE that we are required to use (and the standard for all contact investigation as far as I know).</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● 15 minutes within 6 ft - masked is a close contact</li> <li>● 40 minutes in a classroom with the suspected or confirmed case is a contact</li> <li>● Were within 12 feet of the individual for 15 minutes or greater, when either party is unmasked and indoors (e.g. mealtimes)</li> </ul> <p><u><a href="#">Who is a Close Contact</a></u> - CDPHE outbreak guidance</p> <p>No windows open in MoHi so air flow has been increased.</p> <p>Closed campus for in person learning during the pandemic - an adjustment for students who were used to going off campus.</p> <p>1580 students currently enrolled, 259 elected into home learning only but must be prepared for students to flex between in person and home learning due to changing health and safety needs</p>
