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Community, Enrollment and Faculty Data

District 125 operates one comprehensive high school, Adlai E. Stevenson, which is accredited by the state. The school serves the communities of Lincolnshire, Long Grove, Prairie View, and portions of Buffalo Grove, Deerfield, Mundelein, Hawthorn Woods, Vernon Hills, Lake Forest, Indian Creek, Wheeling, Lake Zurich, Riverwoods, Kildeer, Palatine and Mettawa.

Total enrollment for 2020-21 is 4,317 with 1,100 of those students being seniors.

The faculty consists of 314 certified staff, 93% with at least a Master's degree. There are 21 full-time counselors and two full-time post secondary counselors.

Stevenson High School is one of only six high schools in the country to receive the United States Department of Education's "Excellence in Education" Blue Ribbon Award five times. In addition, Stevenson has been named one of America's top high schools by multiple organizations, and has been named a school of distinction in arts education by the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts.

COVID-19 Response

Stevenson High School completed the 2019-20 school year with students learning remotely. The remote learning period, which began on March 30, 2020, and continued through the end of the school year, consisting of a combination of synchronous and asynchronous instruction.

Stevenson High School followed the grading recommendations of the Illinois State Board of Education, including the principle of no educational harm to any child. Grades earned as of March 31, 2020, could only improve after that date. We continued to use our evidence-based grading practices however, no grade of F was issued during the second semester of 2019-20. Unresolved incomplete grades resulted in an NC or "No Credit" grade. The State-required SAT exam was waived for any senior in the Class of 2020 who had not previously completed the exam. Our teachers used a combination of synchronous and asynchronous instructional methods. No adjustments were made to our school calendar.

Presently we committed to an eLearning (remote) model for the Fall 2020 semester. All classes, with the exception of a few special service classes, are taking place in a virtual classroom format. At the start of the 2020-21 academic year, SHS resumed normal grading practices. We will make a decision about the Spring 2021 semester in the coming months.



Stevenson High School is within a 30-minute drive from the following high schools: Deerfield, Highland Park, Lake Forest, New Trier, Buffalo Grove, Carmel, Barrington, Fremd, Glenbrook North, Glenbrook South, Libertyville, Vernon Hills, Mundelein, Lake Zurich, Warren and Wauconda.



Curriculum

Stevenson High School offers a wide variety of courses in order to challenge each student to achieve to his/her potential. More than 250 courses are offered, some on different levels of content depth and breadth. Classes taken at Stevenson are 47 minutes in length, five days per week, 38 weeks per year.

Students receive one credit per semester for each course successfully completed (except for those taken at the Lake County Technology Campus and most Advanced Placement science classes, which meet for 1.5 periods per day).

A total of 33 Advanced Placement (AP) classes are offered. For many years, Stevenson High School has been an international leader in the number of AP classes offered and exams administered. Freshmen at Stevenson do not enroll in AP courses. There also are 16 honor-level courses not designated as AP.

Graduation Requirements

Students receive one credit per semester for each course successfully completed (except for those taken at the Lake County Technology Campus and Advanced Placement science classes, which meet for 1.5 periods per day). A total of 45 semester credits is required for graduation.

Grading System

Letter grades are assigned a different point value at each class level as follows, with the College Prep serving as our standard:

A weighted and an unweighted grade point average are calculated for each student every semester. All courses are included in these averages except for physical education, driver education, correspondence courses, pass/fail courses, audit and independent study courses, and courses taken as part of an exchange program.

Students may elect to waive the grade from certain nonacademic elective courses from the calculation of their grade point average.

Stevenson High School does not report class rank of any kind. Beginning with the Class of 2020, Stevenson High School will not put the language proficiency classes from middle school on transcripts.

Students may retake any course. The original grade will remain on the transcript. The GPA will be determined by using the points from the higher of the two grades. Duplicate credit will not be issued.

Transcript Information

Official Stevenson High School transcripts are released only to an accredited educational institution or to the NCAA Eligibility Center. All transcripts are sent electronically through Parchment. A weighted and unweighted grade point average are reported for each student. Test scores are not included on the transcript; students request that test scores be forwarded directly from the testing agency.

A counselor signature on a college application verifies the accuracy of the student's academic record. Only information which is a part of the permanent record generated by Stevenson High School can be verified.

Traditional high school courses taken in middle school are not included on the transcript. Students who begin high school in a second year or higher level course have completed the introductory level(s) successfully before entering ninth grade.
