Dear Parents, Relatives and Friends,

We do not have any Covid-19 cases within the school (as far as we can tell) but there continue to be cases in the village community. We have some children and staff who have needed to self-isolate.

To reduce the risk of the virus entering the school, we are going to ask parents to continue to wear a face covering; drop off and pick up quickly and go straight home; socially distance; only send packed lunches into school that are disposable; explain to your child that they cannot bring any items into school that are not necessary; keep your child off of school if any member of your family has Covid-19 symptoms; keep your child off school if they are unwell and to keep the school updated of suspected Covid cases, illness and absences due to self-isolation. Before or during school, do not give your child any medication containing paracetamol because this could bring down a child's temperature and mask Covid-19 symptoms.

Additionally, we are requesting the following:

Please make sure your child has all they need with them in the morning. This includes water bottles, jumpers, packed lunches and books. Unless it is essential, we are asking you not to deliver late items to the front reception after your child has come into school. The reason for this is that school staff then have to cross over bubbles to deliver the items to the classes, which increases risk.

Please could I ask parents not to allow their children to play outside the front of the school at pick-up time. This encourages children from different bubbles to mix with one another. We realise that it can be difficult to wait while the children are coming out of school, but please could you keep your children safely by your side when they are in your care.

We have had some requests for children to attend Buddies Club as a 'one-off'. I'm afraid that we only accept children on a regular basis for the time being so that the group of children is consistent helping us to reduce risk and so keep Buddies open.

Our school is welcoming and nurturing. Please don't hesitate to ask if you have any queries or wish to discuss any matter.

### Ladybird's Star of the Week is Elise






Chicken pox is a red spotty rash (which often appears as small blisters) mainly on the body but can be all over.

Can you please report any cases to the school straight away and keep your child off of school until all spots have scabbed over. Thank you.

Chickenpox is an acute, infectious disease and is most commonly seen in children under 10 years old. This virus can also cause shingles, which tends to be more common in adults. The disease can be more serious in adults, particularly pregnant women. If you have concerns, please take medical advice.

If your child is eligible for the Government-funded free school meals, available for all children in Reception, Year 1, Year 2 and those with Free School Meals status, then you do <u>not</u> need to access ParentPay.

#### How will you choose your child's meal?

Menus will be available for parents to view on the Educaterers website. However, children will be ordering their own meals each morning in school, at 9am in their classroom, so you do not need to pre-order and select meals any longer.
