### First quarter honor roll

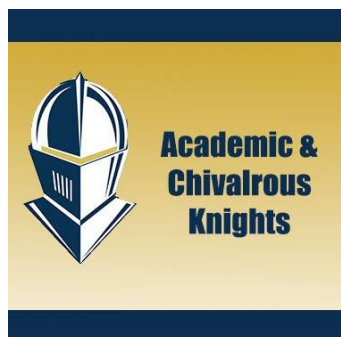

### Guest speakers visit classes through Zoom videos

HOBAN ALUMNI WITH HOPE TO BRING

The One Hope-One Dream award was created in 2003 and recognizes Hoban graduates whose values, attitudes and behaviors exemplify living out a dream that brings hope to others. After several years, Hoban's Equity and Inclusion Committee is reinstating the One Hope-One Dream alumni award tradition. The award recalls the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King's historic "I Have a Dream" speech and incorporates the Holy Cross core value of Hope which comes from the school motto Ave Crux, Spes Unica ("Hail, the Cross, Our Only Hope").

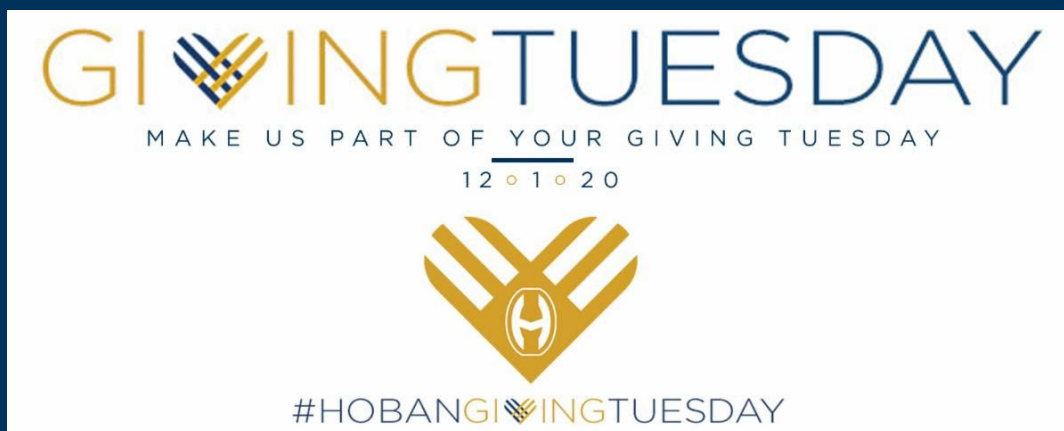
Nominees must meet three criteria:
