



District Notification of Positive COVID-19 Cases

November 24, 2020

Dear FPS Parents, Guardians, and Staff;

Today, we have identified a positive case at Dwight Elementary School, requiring several teachers to quarantine effective immediately. As a result, for the **week of November 30, all grade 5 classes at Dwight will be remote**, using the [Instructional Plans for Emergency Closure](#) schedule. The Dwight grade 5 team will be in contact with their students and families with more information.

In addition, we have the following new positive cases:

Fairfield Warde 2 Burr 1 (RLA) McKinley 1 (RLA) ECC Warde 1

Contact tracing has been confirmed and any close contacts are now in quarantine. No building closures are indicated. If there is a need for anyone else to self-quarantine, they will be contacted directly by a member of the Fairfield Health Department Contact Tracing Team.

Information related to case investigations is confidential and private health information will not be disclosed by FPS or the Fairfield Health Department. Health and safety protocols were followed in consultation with Sands Cleary, Director of the Fairfield Health Department, and Jill Mitchell RN, Nursing Supervisor.

The safety of our community is our priority. We are monitoring this situation closely and will continue to keep you informed of any changes or additional information.

IMPORTANT DEFINITIONS



Case: Individual who tests positive for SARS-CoV-2 by laboratory-confirmed PCR or Antigen Test.



Close Contact: Person exposed for 15 minutes or more, cumulative in a 24 hour period, within six feet of a Case.



School setting: classroom, other interior school location, bus stop, bus or other form of transportation, school grounds, or school-related event held at other locations.

Contact Tracing: Close contacts in the school setting will be identified by the School Nurse, Principal and Central Office working with the Fairfield Health Department's Contact Tracing Team and advised to quarantine for 14 days.
