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COURSES TO ENHANCE YOUR UNDERSTANDING Years 10 to 12

FutureLearn offer free courses in a broad range of subjects to enhance learning and widen your interest in a range of subjects. Courses vary in length but there are some great two to three-week courses, comprising three hours learning a week at a time to suit you. These courses are perfect to help give you a better understanding of a subject area and help you explore subjects you might want to consider studying at university. You can learn by watching videos, listening to audio and reading articles. Many of these steps are followed by short quizzes to help you check you have understood and there is an online forum to discuss your subject with other learners. Subject areas include Literature, IT and Computer Science, Nature and Environment, Religion, History, Politics and Society and Criminology.
