How to know if School is closed due bad weather?

We are approaching that time of year when school closures are more likely due to adverse

weather conditions. We will of course make every effort to keep the school open and will only close if there is a health and safety risk to pupils in school or parents/staff travelling to and from home.

If the decision is made to close the school, then we will notify the Emergency School Closures website straight away. This is an excellent communication service for you to use. You can log into the website to see a list of closed schools. Also, parents can sign up to receive an automatic text message alert if the school is closed. This is a great messaging service.

Texts sent to this number are charged at your normal operator rate. **Note** - it is important that you include the word 'on' at the end of you message.

When you have registered, you will receive a text message confirming your registration almost straight away. For the next year, you will be notified by text automatically if for any reason, the school has to close. [You will need to register again if you change your mobile phone number]. We will also leave a notification on the school website on the 'News Headlines' section on the front page. The website address is: www.bishopsitchington.com. Seesaw messages and emails will also be sent to you.

If you pay for school lunches

When we have moved to Educaterers, all lunches will be paid for in advance using ParentPay and not DinnerPay. If any parent does not have access to ParentPay, please contact Claudia Potter in the school office on Potter C@stowevalley.com.

Infant meals and Free School Meals

If your child is eligible for the Government-funded free school meals, available for all children in Reception, Year 1, Year 2 and those with Free School Meals status, then you do <u>not</u> need to access ParentPay.

How will you choose your child's meal?

Menus will be available for parents to view on the Educaterers website. However, children will be ordering their own meals each morning in school, at 9am in their classroom, so you do not need to pre-order and select meals any longer.



FoBIPS Escape Room





Sunday 20th December time slots between 10am – 4pm and Monday 21st December time slots between 3pm – 6pm

An online fun family event where you can compete against other family groups in this festive virtual Escape Room experience. Connect and have fun with 7 other households (online) and get into the festive spirit by helping to save Christmas! As these escape rooms are fairly new experiences, we thought a few more details would give everyone a better understanding of what this type of event involves.

What is an online escape room? - It's a game that you can play via a laptop or PC with friends from the comfort of your own home.

What equipment do I need? You will need a laptop or PC, internet connection, a pen and paper and access to an email account.

Do I need a Zoom account? No you don't need a Zoom account, you will be sent a zoom link and it is advisable that you click on the link 5 minutes before your timeslot.

How long will it take to play? We envisage that the game will take between 30mins and 45mins to play – this will be dependent on the number of teams in your time slot.

How many people play at the same time? We have set the maximum number of teams as 8 for this event, there is no maximum number of people in your team.

FoBIPS Escape Room continued

How does the game work?

A FoBIPS member (known as a handler) will email you the starting slide.

You then read the slide with your team and try and solve the puzzle.

You email back to your handler your answer and they confirm if you are correct and send you the next slide. Or they tell you that you are incorrect.

if you are incorrect or struggling to answer you can request a hint

You can request up to 4 hints per slide

How do you win?

The winning team is the team who solves the escape room first. If two teams are tied, then it will be won by the team who had the least hints. We will have a leader board across all the games.

How much does it cost to take part?

We have set the entry fee as £5 per team, you can donate more if you wish to.

How do I book?

We are in the process of setting up a pre booking system and will let you know the details once we are able to make it live.

You will need to book with your team name, designated email address and payment of £5 in your preferred timeslot choice by **Wednesday 16**th **December.**
