The plan going forward for this year is to reinstate our SBAC testing so that we can officially determine how much learning loss has occurred. Right now is our chance to focus on learning, to participate as much as possible, and to let our children develop as independent learners.

When our students do participate in SBAC testing, they will be doing it independently. Teachers will read instructions, but no assistance from teachers or parents is allowed. Remember parents, you have already done the elementary school work, now it is your child's turn.

So as we jump into trimester two, please remind your child to participate fully, attend daily, work hard, and shine in school; all of which can be done online or on-site.

clusion sentences. We are reviewing using capital letters at the beginning of sentence, punctuation at the end of a sentence, along with spacing and letter formation.

The students have just finished our unit on adding and subtracting number to 12. We will begin Topic 5: Addition Facts to 20.

With Thanksgiving approaching we have discussed about the First Thanksgiving and how we celebrate today. The students wrote about what they are thankful for. We are thankful for such hard working first graders!



## **5TH GRADE NEWS**

We have enjoyed reading our second novel and are making progress with fifth grade ELA content standards.
