a Message from our Leaders

Dear Warrior Family,

Ten years ago as I stepped onto this beautiful campus at 7851 Gardendale Street, I learned about the rich legacy of two unique and incredible school communities that endured complex challenges spanning 60 years (1953-2013), yet still maintained their courageous spirit in fulfilling one mission, to bring the values of an authentic Catholic education to teenagers in Southeast Los Angeles County. That courageous spirit continues today at St. Pius X-St. Matthias Academy (PMA) and our story as reflected in this "Building a Legacy 2019-2020 Annual Report" is one that I hope continues to inspire your unwavering support of our mission through what some will call the most challenging and unprecedented times yet.

Despite the challenges we face as a Catholic school in a COVID-19 environment, it is evident that your commitment to manifesting the values of family, faith, and investment in Catholic college preparatory education for youth continues to make a tremendous impact on the lives of the students and families served by PMA. Although the pandemic has presented troubling challenges for our school's bottom line, the experience of navigating through uncharted territory has brought about a new resolve and focus to effectively minister to the needs of those students and families God has called us to serve. Our teachers, staff, and administrators have literally made miracles happen with distance learning and the added strains of learning new online platforms while supporting students in their academic, social, and emotional needs during these difficult times of separation.

At the beginning of the 2020-2021 school year, I announced that I would be stepping down as President at PMA in order to answer a call to serve Catholic schools in a greater capacity as an Assistant Superintendent at the Department of Catholic Schools for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles. I am truly humbled to have had the opportunity to serve, lead, build, and be a part of such an amazing, resilient, spirit and faith filled community over the last 10 years. I will deeply miss working with our board, staff, parents, students, and alumni. 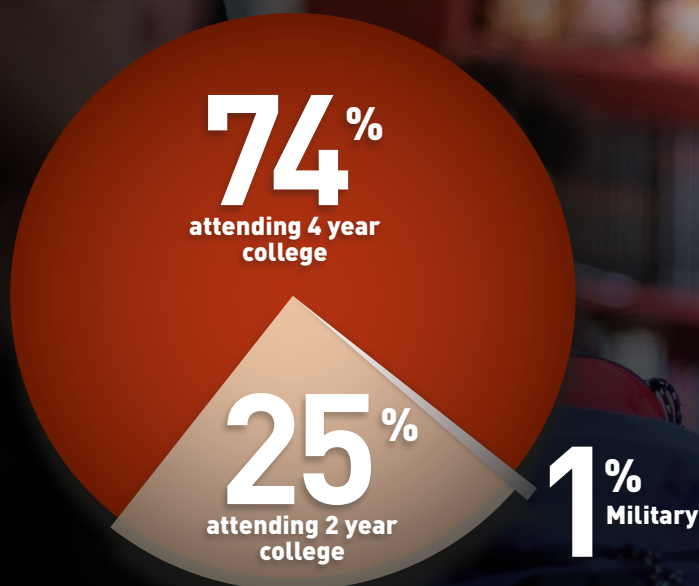

2020 Valedictorian

Having earned the coveted Valedictorian honor, Briana Torres was filled with Warrior Pride as she stepped on stage to address her class during the June 12th drive-through graduation for the Class of 2020.

Briana was born and raised in South Central Los Angeles and before coming to PMA she attended Kindergarten through Eighth Grade at nearby St. Rafael Elementary School. Having heard about the Onward Scholars Program (OSP), made possible by The John H. & Cynthia Lee Smet Foundation, through a close friend, Briana applied for the program at PMA and was awarded one of 12 coveted spots that year. The OSP Scholarship includes 75% of the cost of tuition which she says, significantly lessened the burden on her parents and made it possible to attend a Catholic high school.

During Briana's four years at PMA she played soccer, served on ASB, and founded a club called Eco Ambassadors which promoted environmental issues. She graduated as a member of NHS (National Honor Society), NEHS (National English Honor Society) and CSF (California Scholarship Federation). In addition to her honors and extracurriculars, Briana volunteered with her parish/former elementary school, The Special Olympics and at Downey First Christian Church's food bank.

When asked about her favorite PMA memories Briana says, "Kairos 11 will be a memory I hold forever dear to my heart because of the bonds created. It was its own time and place, like we were in our own dimension, like a little bubble." She goes on to add that she really enjoyed being part of the boys' basketball championship season because it promoted a lot of school spirit.

Although Briana was accepted into thirteen colleges/universities, among them LMU, UCLA and Cal Berkeley, to name a few, she has chosen to spend the next four years at Stanford University, where she earned a full scholarship. "Stanford still feels unreal, but my shortcomings will be my motivation," Briana says. The first in her family to go to college, Briana says she grew up with everything she needed but watched her parents constantly struggle to make ends meet and her goal is to be able to repay them one day. "My mom works at a food truck and my dad works at a car wash, it would be a waste of their life's work for me not to succeed," Briana concludes.

When asked how her four years at PMA helped form her, Briana talks about the way the school helped shape her morals, ethics and her way of thinking. "My parents sacrificed everything so that I could be in an environment that promotes learning and allowed me to make lifelong friendships and meet incredible people along the way. I am so thankful for Mr. and Mrs. Smet and the phenomenal resources and workshops that come as part of OSP that have prepared me for college." Briana especially recognizes Ms. Turcios, St. Matthias '10, the Director of the Onward Scholar Program, for playing a pivotal role in her college acceptances and helping to open so many doors.

Briana's area of study is undeclared but she has interest in psychology, sociology, economics and foreign language. She is considering careers in international business, law, social work and with the FBI as a behavioral analyst. PMA is confident that Briana will succeed in whatever path she chooses to pursue and looks forward to celebrating her future accomplishments.

2020 Salutatorian

Salutatorian, Andrew Briones, had much to celebrate during the Class of 2020's graduation festivities. Having been raised in Downey, attending Kindergarten through Eighth Grade at St. Raymond's Parish School, and then matriculating down the road to PMA, Andrew made his high school choice because it was close to home and really felt like the right school for him. As high school comes to a close he appreciates his choice even more crediting the school for helping him reach his potential and prepare him for college. "The way things are done at PMA, the courses provided, the clubs and athletics, make me ready for the next step," Andrew says.

Central to everything PMA does is the beauty and tradition of its Catholic Faith Foundation. Whether in the classroom, on the courtyard or during competition, prayer is infused in the daily life of the school community. This academic year was no exception as PMA experienced continued growth in student engagement through service on and off campus and student led prayer and participation in the sacraments.

Regular opportunities for young people to develop their faith life include: Monthly school wide Mass, Adoration, Sacrament of Reconciliation, weekly Morning Mass in the beautiful "Chapel of Pius X" and seasonal events and prayer services.

Retreats are another part of Catholic school life that PMA students hold dear. One retreat is held per grade level and there are normally three Kairos Retreat opportunities for seniors, which was modified to two last year due to COVID-19 restrictions. These experiences draw students closer to God and also to one another.

Putting faith into action through service is a graduation requirement that students fulfill during their four years at PMA. Other opportunities to communicate and live out the faith include: Annual Catholic Schools Week, Respect Life Week, Saint of the Day, and evangelization through guest speakers and social media.

PMA's 2019-2020 theme of "Fiat", exuberantly saying yes to God, was lived out during both the celebrations and the challenges. The school community leaned into faith and each other, united in its mission, trusting that God is in control.

a Year of. Champions

Our PMA athletic teams, despite the Pandemic, found plenty of success during the year.

The Boys Cross Country team continued their prior seasons successes by capturing a spot in the CIF Finals. Boys Soccer earned a spot in the CIF playoffs.

The Girls' Cross Country, Soccer, Volleyball and Basketball Teams all had fantastic seasons which saw them all earn league titles for the first time in PMA history.

In just 3 years since football was reintroduced, the team finished with an undefeated regular season record and took home a Camino Real League Title. The team continued its success through the playoffs, which earned them a spot in the CIF Southern Section Championship Game.

The Boys Varsity Basketball Team had one of the best seasons in school history and wrapped up a few prestigious honors along the way. The Varsity Basketball Team earned a CIF Southern Section playoff berth with an impressive 29-7 record, from there they quickly found themselves playing for the Division 4A Championship where they went on to beat Oakwood and capture the CIF Division 4A Southern Section Title. Their play earned them a spot in the State Tournament, making it to the quarter finals. Coach Donte Archie was named the Division 4A Coach of the Year while Senior, Denzel Okoli, was named the California State Division 4A Player of The Year as well as receiving Division 4 California First Team Honors. Senior, Rafael Gomez, and Junior, Ethan Mccanless, were also awarded All-CIF honors and the entire varsity basketball team made tremendous contributions to the success of the season.

Unfortunately, with the pandemic starting in March and the school operations having moved online, all spring sports had to be cancelled. We look forward to once again seeing Baseball, Softball, Track and Field, and Boys' Volleyball all return to competition in the new school year. With the pandemic still going on, CIF made the decision to start the Fall 20-21 Seasons in December 2020. We hope to continue building on our success and look forward to seeing all our fans at future PMA sporting events. Go Warriors!

St. Pius X - St. Matthias Academy is the grateful recipient of a grant from the Frank McHugh-O'Donovan Foundation that went toward the purchase of three passenger vans. The funds gifted to the school, combined with proceeds from the 2019 Warrior Cup Golf Classic were used to purchase three much needed passenger vans. As PMA grows, its need to transport students for academic as well as athletic, campus ministry, and student activity purposes grows as well. We anticipate a savings of approximately \$20,000 annually to our transportation budget. The savings from this expense will be reallocated to help those students most in need.

Just as funding for the vans was received and the purchase made, COVID-19 hit. The school leaned into the strength of its alumni to push through to completion this heartfelt endeavor, which included branding the new vehicles with the school logo. Downey's own Rapid O Print, whose owners are Pius X Alums, Alex Triay '88 and Robert Triay '87, worked quickly to get the vans properly branded.

The school is so very grateful to the Frank McHugh-O'Donovan Foundation, Warrior Cup 2019 supporters, and Rapid-O Print for making the beautiful finished passenger vans possible. Having been blessed during the Mass celebrating St. Pius X's feast day on August 21st, the small fleet of vans readily awaits the return of the students they will serve.

During a Pandemic

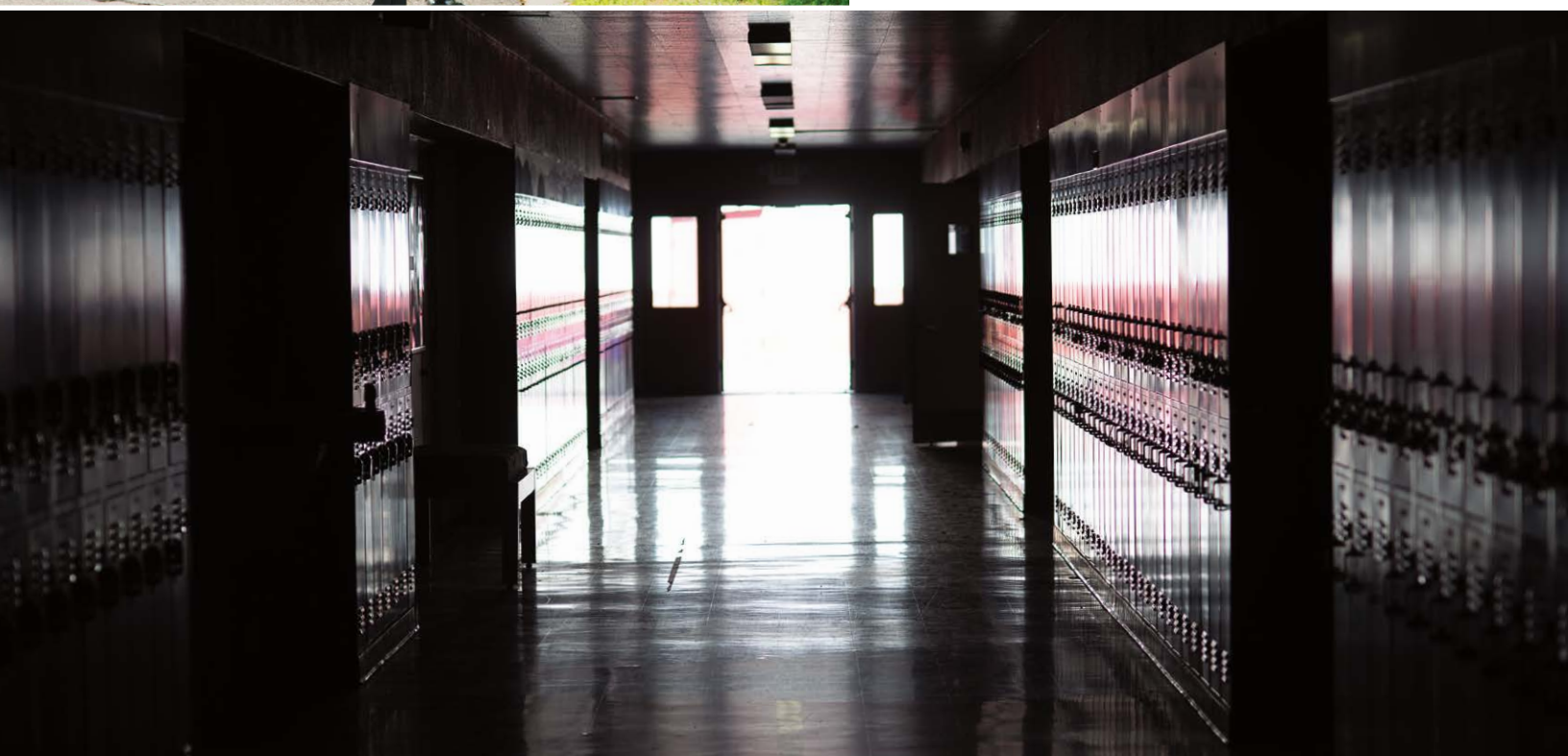
There is a new normal operating today, one that our world faces together and one that changes day to day and week to week. With schools at the epicenter of this new reality, St. Pius X - St. Matthias Academy is only too familiar with the increased demands for flexibility, creativity and innovation.

PMA's leadership met challenges head on and successfully remained a step ahead of what would be required to best serve its students, impressively navigating through uncharted waters. The ingenuity of those who were able to pivot and redevelop our educational delivery system was nothing short of heroic, with only two days allotted for the transition. Dedicated faculty and hard-working staff, worked diligently with leadership to deliver a seamless transition to distance learning.

Teaching and learning remotely called for educators to learn new ways to deliver curriculum while at the same time problem solving through technological limitations which plagued many of PMA's students. Things that many of us take for granted like available internet, a working webcam and a quiet distraction-free workspace, were not the reality for some of PMA's students. In addition to working through the added challenges, the school found ways to keep kids connected using Zoom as a tool for prayer services, counseling, and movie nights. The school even celebrated its first ever drive-through Baccalaureate Mass and Graduation Ceremony for the Class of 2020.

Safety measures such as free standing and wall mounted hand sanitizers, mandatory masks and temperature checks before stepping on campus, social distancing protocol, among other important details, were implemented to make returning to campus safe for employees. The sights and sounds of students are sorely missed, their absence tugging at the hearts of their PMA family left to walk empty hallways, teach in empty classrooms and stare out at deserted playing fields.

Never losing sight of the mission to provide opportunities for all students to grow in faith, learn without limits, and live with a purpose, and armed with Christ at the center of everything it does, the school finished strong and heroes were born, among both teacher and student, during the "Time of COVID".

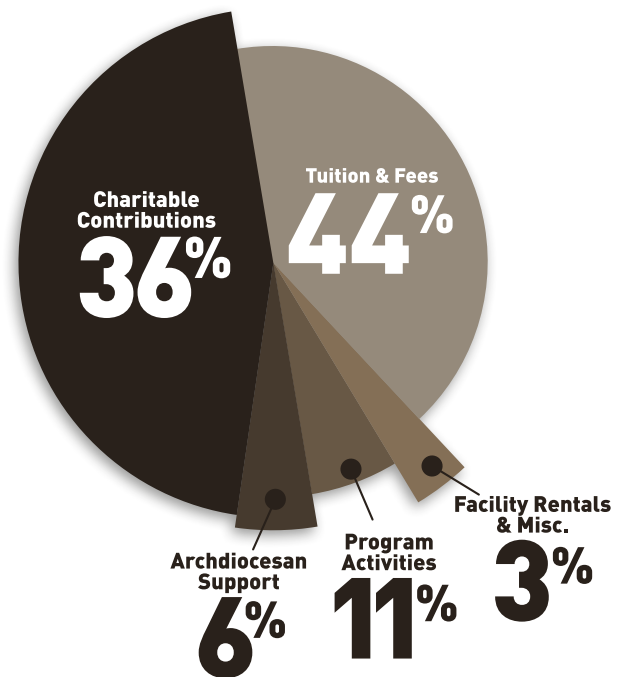

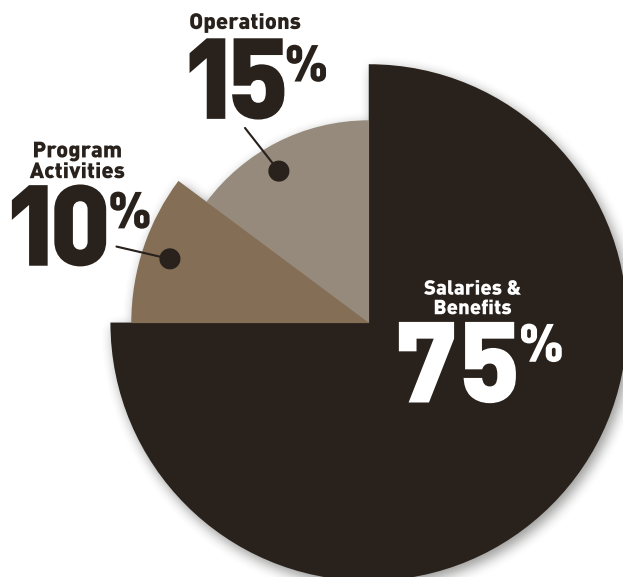
